GOD'S MESSAGE ABOUT FORGIVENESS

I. In His dealings with repentant sinner II. In His teaching a self-righteous sinner III. In His message to a believing sinner

I. Message of forgiveness in Christ's dealings with a repentant sinner

- A. A history of a sinful past is no hindrance to seeking His forgiveness
 - 1. Her appearance caused an enormous discomfort and stir
 - 2. Her attraction to Jesus is that *He came to seek and save sinners like her* a. compare and reflect on Luke 5:27, 30 – 5:32 – 7:34 – 15:1-2
- B. Repentance is clearly important in seeking His forgiveness (vs.38)
 - 1. Repentance doesn't make us worthier but sends a message to Christ/God
 - 2. Repentance isn't always spoken with words: every actions in this woman spoke her genuine sorrow over sin as well as love to God
- C. Christ's example of received her is a reassuring invitation for us

II. Message of Forgiveness in Christ's teaching of a self-righteous sinner

- A. The point of contact between Christ and a sinner is our sin (vs. 39)
 - 1. Simon thought the point of contact was his righteousness
 - 2. Sin is not *hindrance* to come to Christ but sin is the most *compelling reason* for coming to Christ for forgiveness
- B. Forgiveness is a matter of pure grace alone for we are all debtors (vs. 40-42) 1. How many sins does it take to make us a debtor?
 - 2. What means have we to pay our God for even one sin?
 - 3. Yet God is here today to receive debtors as her to pardon them!
 - Archibald Alexander: You cannot gratify the heart of the sympathizing Savior more than by exercising confidence in His power and willingness to save you!

- C. Believing the willingness of God's readiness to pardon will stir up the flames of real love to Him (42-47)
 - 1. Jesus contrasted her love to Simon's callous lack of love and dishonor
 - 2. What made her love the Lord Jesus so intensely?a. not because she already experienced forgiveness (48, 50)
 - b. but she saw in Jesus the glory of God's character of love
 - Simon's eyes saw God as a God Whose favor you need to earn
 - Woman's eyes saw Jesus as God Who is gracious in His love
 - 3. Love to God is always the fruit of faith in God's nature/character!

III. The Message of Divine Forgiveness to a believing sinner

A. Jesus never hides the truth: the woman's sins are many (47)

- 1. when God forgives, He doesn't ignore sin but deal with sin
- God's way of dealing with sin is *through transfer substitution* a. God doesn't cancel the debt by simply 'cancelling it'
 - b. God cancels the debt of sin by 'making payment for it.'
 - Gospel of Jesus' cross is God's solution to the problem of sin
- B. Jesus openly declares reality of woman's forgiveness (48-50)
 - 1. He does that only when He sees faith in Him
 - 2. What Jesus spoke to this woman then, He now speaks to all upright believers today!
 - a. if you have faith like her in Him, your sins are as forgiven as hers!
 - forgiveness is received not because of her faith in Him
 - forgiveness is received through her faith in Him
 - b. 'go in peace' is go home in the peace with God I have established for you in my personal sacrifice (Romans 5:1)
