• Why should we study the life of Elijah?

I.	ELIJAH'S COURAGEOUS FAITH DURING ISRAEL'S DARK AGES ([17:1-24])
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	1. Politically, Elijah ministered as a prophet mainly in the northern kingdom of Israel from roughly during the reign of King, who formed a political alliance with Phoenicia by marrying King Ethbaal's daughter (16:29-33)
	2. Spiritually, Elijah ministered during Israel's dark ages, when the worship of was (18:3-4, 19-21)
В.	Elijah's Faith before AHAB (17:1)
	1. Elijah's name means (17:1)
	2. He was from the northern region of (17:1)
	3. Elijah prepared for his confrontation with King Ahab by in faith (James 5:16-18), according to the (Lev. 26:18-20; Deut. 11:16-17; 28:23-24; 1 Kings 8:35-36).

	4. Elijah recognized that though he was standing in the presence of King, he was really standing before (17:1; cf. Matt. 28:20; Acts 9:15-16; Eph. 3:1; Phil. 1:13)

• Where did Elijah's courage and boldness come from?

C. Elijah's Faith at CHERITH (17:2-7)

1. The <i>place</i> of God's provision for Elijah was at the Brook Cherith, approximately miles southeast of the capital city of Samaria. (17:1-6)
• Does God have a specific place for you in His will? (Ps. 37:23; Prov. 3:5-6; James 4:13-15)
2. The <i>manner</i> of God's provision for Elijah was both, with the water brook, and, with the ravens feeding him per day. (17:4, 6)
3. The timing of God's provision for Elijah at Cherith lasted, until the brook literally (17:7), and the Lord commanded him to move to the Phoenician coastal town of Zarephath (17:8-9).
D. Elijah's Faith at ZAREPHATH (17:8-24)
1. The Lord directed Elijah to Zarephath, a coastal town near (17:8-9)—an unlikely place for an Israeli prophet of Jehovah to hide (18:10)—but also a place where a lived who would to the Lord (Luke 4:24-26).
2. This was a test of faith for both Elijah and the widow, not to look at their but at (17:10-16)
3. The Lord brought an even greater test for Elijah and the widow by allowing her son to again. (17:17-24)
