Mark's Gospel—Jesus' True Identity Reveals the Magnitude of His Sacrifice

10:30 Morning Worship Service:

Mark 1:1-11

The King's Highway

This is an announcement of the new beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

- 1. God Is Making a New Beginning (Gospel) Through His Son (1).
- 2. Isaiah and the Other Prophets Support This Announcement (2-3).
- 3. **John Came** *Preparing People Through Baptism* **for This New Beginning** (4-8).
- 4. The Father & Spirit Confirm Jesus IS God's Beloved Son (9-11).

Conclusion: God's people have been waiting for Messiah, but they have *not* repented as they should. God had promised that He would send a messenger ahead of the Messiah *to prepare the way before the Lord*. In preparation, the Lord would move among His people and bring about a *great repentance*. In this passage God is doing that in and through Christ as He identifies with His people, being washed in the Jordan to herald a new work among His people. All three persons of the Godhead are engaged in this revelatory work declaring Jesus is the Messiah who has come.

Exodus 23:20-21

²⁰ "Behold, I send an angel before you to guard you on the way and to bring you to the place that I have prepared. ²¹ Pay careful attention to him and obey his voice; do not rebel against him, for he will not pardon your transgression, for my name is in him.

Isaiah 40:1-5

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

³ A voice cries:

"In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

⁴Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

⁵ And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

Malachi 3:1-4

"Behold, I send my messenger, and he will prepare the way before me. And the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple; and the messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, behold, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. ² But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap. ³ He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and they will bring offerings in righteousness to the Lord. ⁴ Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

Malachi 4:5-6

⁵ "Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet *before* the great and awesome day of the Lord comes. ⁶ And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction."

Taking Gathered Worship Home

God is doing something radically new in the Gospel of Mark. He is making all things new by preparing the way for the Messiah. This good news was a bombshell blasting away all the false façade that tradition had built up around the coming Day of the Lord.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday Morning

READ Mark 1:1-11; Exodus 23:20-1; Isaiah 40:1-5; Malachi 3:1-4; 4:5-6; 2 Kings 1:5-8; Acts 13:16-25; 2 Peter 1:16-21; Psalm 84:1-12. DISCUSS Who is Jesus? Why is His identity so significant? What does His coming bring? How are you different because of His coming? SERVE someone in need. MEDITATE on Mark 8:27-29. PRAY "Father God, Thank You for sending Your Son. Enable us to recognize Him properly."

Sunday Evening

GATHER for Young Adult Fellowship at 5pm at Karis' home.

Monday

READ Mark 1:2-3; Exodus 23:20-21; Isaiah 40:1-5; Psalm 84:1-12. DISCUSS What does God promise in bringing prophets to the people? How do these point forward to John? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE Mark 8:27-29. PRAY, "Jesus, Thank You for faithfully keeping Your promises to Your covenant people. We praise You for leading us every step of the way into Your presence."

Tuesday

READ Mark 1:2-3; Malachi 3:1-4; 4:5-6; Psalm 84:1-12. DISCUSS How does the Old Testament close? What are they waiting for? How does the arrival of John fulfill that? SERVE by considering someone else's needs *above your own*! MEDITATE on Mark 8:27-29. PRAY, "Holy Spirit, thank You for giving us Your Word and for fulfilling it in the right time. Teach us to walk with You and to follow Your lead with the whole of our lives."

Wednesday

READ Mark 1:4-8; Second Kings 1:5-8; Acts 13:16-25. DISCUSS How did John continue Elijah's role? SERVE by *caring about someone else* more than yourself! MEDITATE on Mark 8:27-29. PRAY, "Lord God, thank You for revealing Yourself to us through Your prophets. Enliven our hearts to hear Your Word and rejoice in Your coming, Jesus! We praise You as our Messiah."

Thursday

READ Mark 1:9-11; 2 Peter 1:16-21; Malachi 4:5-6. DISCUSS What similarities do you see between Creation and Christ's baptism? Do you see all three members of the Trinity? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on Mark 8:27-29. PRAY, "Triune God, thank You for the way You have shown us Your glory and loved us with Your whole self."

Friday

READ Mark 1:1-11; Exodus 23:20-1; Isaiah 40:1-5; Malachi 3:1-4; 4:5-6; 2 Kings 1:5-8; Acts 13:16-25; 2 Peter 1:16-21; Psalm 84:1-12. DISCUSS, What has the Holy Spirit been teaching you this week through these passages? MEDITATE on Mark 8:27-29. PRAY that we at FCCW would be transformed together by God's incarnation and live together in the reality of His continued presence through His Spirit.

Saturday

PREPARE for *gathered worship tomorrow*. READ **Mark 1:1-45**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the *worship service* @ **10:30**. Ask Jesus to reveal Himself to us in His Word by His Spirit.

Meditate on this—Mark 8:27-29

"And Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi. And on the way he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that I am?' And they told him, 'John the Baptist; and others say, Elijah; and others, one of the prophets.' And he asked them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter answered him, 'You are the Christ.'"
