## The Heidelberg Catechism

## 21. What is true faith?

True faith is not only a sure knowledge whereby I hold for truth all that God has revealed to us in His Word,<sup>1</sup> but also a hearty trust,<sup>2</sup> which the Holy Spirit<sup>3</sup> works in me by the Gospel,<sup>4</sup> that not only to others, but to me also,<sup>5</sup> forgiveness of sins, everlasting righteousness, and salvation are freely given by God,<sup>6</sup> merely of grace, only for the sake of Christ's merits.<sup>7</sup>
