Psalm 97

1 The LORD reigneth; let the earth rejoice; let the multitude of isles be glad thereof. 2 Clouds and darkness are round about him: righteousness and judgment are the habitation of his throne. 3 A fire goeth before him, and burneth up his enemies round about. 4 His lightnings enlightened the world: the earth saw, and trembled. 5 The hills melted like wax at the presence of the LORD, at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth. 6 The heavens declare his righteousness, and all the people see his glory.

7 Confounded be all they that serve graven images, that boast themselves of idols: worship him, all ye gods.

8 Zion heard, and was glad; and the daughters of Judah rejoiced because of thy judgments, O LORD. 9 For thou, LORD, art high above all the earth: thou art exalted far above all gods.

10 Ye that love the LORD, hate evil: he preserveth the souls of his saints; he delivereth them out of the hand of the wicked. 11 Light is sown for the righteous, and gladness for the upright in heart. 12 Rejoice in the LORD, ye righteous; and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness.

Introduction:

- 1. This Psalm celebrates the LORD's power and dominion.
- 2. This is also a prophetic Psalm where the believers are rejoicing and the enemies (idolaters) will be judged and destroyed (condemned).

Outline:

- A. The Revelation of the LORD's Glory (vv.1-6) $P_{\rm ev}$
 - B. Exhortation to Worship (v.7)
 - B.' Zion's Worship (vv.8-9)
- A.' The Effects of the LORD's Glory (vv.10-12)

Observations:

- 1. (vv.1-6) Is a description of God's majestic Kingdom.
- 2. (vv.7-9) Is a description of God's judgment upon idolaters. (cf. Heb. 1:6).
- 3. (vv.10-12) Is an exhortation to godliness and spiritual rejoicing.

Psalm 98

1 A Psalm. O sing unto the LORD a new song; for he hath done marvellous things: his right hand, and his holy arm, hath gotten him the victory. 2 The LORD hath made known his salvation: his righteousness hath he openly shewed in the sight of the heathen. 3 He hath remembered his mercy and his truth toward the house of Israel: all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

4 Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all the earth: make a loud noise, and rejoice, and sing praise. 5 Sing unto the LORD with the harp; with the harp, and the voice of a psalm. 6 With trumpets and sound of cornet make a joyful noise before the LORD, the King.

7 Let the sea roar, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein. 8 Let the floods clap their hands: let the hills be joyful together 9 Before the LORD; for he cometh to judge the earth: with righteousness shall he judge the world, and the people with equity.

Introduction:

- 1. This Psalm is almost similar to Ps. 96. (v.7 is like 96:11; and v.9 is like 96:13).
- 2. This Psalm celebrates the goodness of the LORD.
- 3. God is to be praised for His past deliverances (Egypt; Sihon; Og; etc.).
- 4. God is to be praised for His future judgment.

Outline:

- A. The LORD's Marvelous Things of the Past (vv.1-3)
 B. Make a Joyful Noise unto the LORD (vv.4-6)
- A.' The LORD's Marvelous Things for the Future (vv.7-9)

Observations:

- 1. Similar themes to the previous Psalms (Royal Psalms which started in Ps. 93 and extends to Ps. 100).
- 2. All (Jews and Gentiles) are exhorted to praise God for His truth and salvation.

Lesson: The LORD is worthy to be praised and is returning to judge Israel's enemies and bring world-wide peace and justice.

Lesson: Jesus Christ is King.
