A Cautionary Tale

Those who conflate religion with public aggression and riotous behavior do harm to Christianity.

I. The Accusation (vv27-29); II. The Assault (vv30-36); III. The Ask (vv37-39)

I. The Accusation (vv27-29)

v27 When the seven days were almost completed, the <u>Jews from Asia</u>, seeing him in the temple, <u>stirred up</u> the whole crowd and laid hands on him,

"Jews from Asia" The Jews of the Dispersion

Acts 20:18-19

"stirred up" = 'confound, confuse, be in an uproar.'

"laid hands on" 'beat into'

v28

"crying out" 'scream, shriek.'

"For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being" Romans 7:22

The true hater of the law is the one who rejects all the evidence in the OT that prove Jesus is the Messiah!

"he even brought Greeks into the temple and has defiled this holy place."

Acts 6:11-13

v29 For they had previously seen <u>Trophimus</u> the Ephesian with him in the city, and they supposed that Paul had brought him into the temple.

II. The Assault (vv30-32)

v30 v31 v32

"the gates were shut"

III. The Assist (vv33-36)

"tribune" Luke uses "chiliarch," ('leader of one thousand'): Claudius Lysias (Acts 23:26).

v33

"bound with two chains" fulfilling the prediction of the prophet Agabus (21:11).

v34

As with most mob scenes, this one is marked by chaos and confusion.

The riot at Ephesus: Acts 19:32

v35 v36

This chant did not mean that they wanted him taken away. It meant that they wanted him killed.

Luke 23:18

"They cried out, 'Away with him, away with him, crucify him!" John 19:15

This is a classic mob scene.

IV. The Ask (vv37-39)

Matthew 10:22

Christian character that will sustain us as society deteriorates:

- 1. Courage (to face opposition),
- 2. Conviction (of the truth),
- 3. Confident (in God's sovereignty),
- 4. Composure (a public testament of true faith),
- 5. Self-restraint, (opposite of unrestrained passion or indulgence)
- 6. Reason (opposite of confusion and chaos),
- 7. Humility (opposite of pride and arrogance).
