



“The Calling”

Serving the Lord
Exodus 29:1-14

God’s calls us to be:

I. Sanctified – “to hallow them, to minister” (vs. 1-4)

The:

- A. **Best** - “young bullock and two rams without blemish”
- B. **Blessed** – “tempered with oil”
- C. **Blameless** – “and shalt wash them with water”

II. Scriptural - “put the holy crown upon the mitre” (vs. 5-9)

Those who:

- A. **Revere** – “take the garments, and put on Aaron”
- B. **Represent**- “take the anointing oil and...anoint him”
- C. **Remember** – “shall be theirs for a perpetual statue”

III. Sacrificial - “that they may minister to Me” (vs. 10-14)

The embracing of:

- A. **Substitution** – “put their hands on the head of the bull”
- B. **Suffering** – “thou shalt kill the bullock before the Lord”
- C. **Sanctifying** – “the blood...put it on the altar’s horns”

Sentence Sermon:

“All believers have a common calling to live according to the sacred text and sacrificially serve others.”
