I. The Anticipation of these False Teachers. v.1a

- 1. False prophets in the former days.

 Cf. Dt.13:1-5; 1 Kings 18:22; Jer.6:14; 14:11-15; 23:15-17; Ez.12:21-28; 28:15
- 2. False teachers in the last days.
 Cf. Matt.7:15; 24:4,5; Acts 20:29,30; I Jn.4:1; 2 Cor.11:13; Rev.2,3

II. The Patriarch of these False Teachers.

Cf. John 8:44; 2 Cor.4:3,4; 10:3,4; 11:13,14; Eph.6:12

III. The Implications of these False Teachers.

- 1. If there are false teachers there must be those who are true teachers. Cf. 1:16-20; 1 Tim.2:1
- 2. If there are true teachers there must be a body of truth. Cf. Jn.6:35; 8:12; 10:11; 14:6; 15:5; 17:3,17; 18:37; Acts 4:12; 1 Tim.2:5

IV. The Character and Methods of these False Teachers. v.1,2

- 1. They are cunning and dangerous. vv.1,13 Cf. Matt.7:15; Jude 4
- 2. They are covetous. vv.3,14 Cf. Matt.23:14
- 3. They are ungodly and promote carnal sensuality. vv.13,14; 3:3
