Deuteronomy 5:12-15; Mark 2:27-28

Observe the Sabbath day, to keep it holy, as the Lord your God commanded you. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work, you or your son or your daughter or your male servant or your female servant, or your ox or your donkey or any of your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates, that your male servant and your female servant may rest as well as you. You shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the Lord your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore the Lord your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath day.

And He said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is lord even of the Sabbath."

The Confession of Faith The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Comment:

The second section of the Apostles' Creed establishes what we believe about our Lord Jesus Christ. The first line of this second section makes it clear that He is the Son of God and He is our Lord. We cannot believe on Jesus without Him being our Lord and Savior. The creed goes on to declare how He entered this world in the miracle of the virgin birth. And it also makes it clear what Jesus has done to save us from our sin. He entered into history to suffer for our sins (He descended into hell), to die on the cross, to be buried and rise again from the dead on the third day. He is now ascended into heaven, seated at the right hand of His Father, interceding for us as our Advocate and Mediator. And one day He will come again to bring in the final judgment of all things! All this He has done and will do for the sake of His church.
