Mark 5:25-34 HEALED BY TOUCHING JESUS' GARMENT

- I. Her affliction.
 - A. The woman suffered from hemorrhaging (a condition of bleeding) over a period of 12 years.
 - B. The result is that she was suffering.
 - 1. She suffered physically, being weak and very frequently very tired.
 - 2. She suffered also from the hands of man physicians (Luke 8:43), who drained her of her money.
 - 3. And she suffered spiritually, for the bleeding made her ceremonially unclean (Leviticus 15:19ff).
- II. Her healing.
 - A. Her only hope for healing was Jesus, especially after the failure of the physicians.
 - 1. She was not allowed any physical contact, so she sought to touch only His outer garment, and then only the hem or fringe.
 - 2. It seems that she repeatedly said to herself, "If I may touch but his robe, I shall be whole" (28; Matt. 9:20).
 - B. And she was healed instantly ("straightway").
- III. Her great faith was the means God was pleased to use to bring her healing (channel not the cause).
 - A. That she had faith (34) implies that she had been regenerated and given the gift of faith.
 - B. Jesus knew what happened (2:5,8; John 1:48; 2:25; 21:17), for "virtue" went from Him.
 - C. Notice that how Jesus affectionately addresses her: "daughter" (34).
 - D. "Thy faith hath made thee whole;" "be whole of thy plague."
 - E. Jesus declares her to be "whole," i.e., saved from suffering, but also now ceremonially and spiritually clean!
