### **Biblical Practices of Communication**

#### A Definition of Good Communication:

"Good communication from God's perspective is sending a message that is true, holy, purposeful, clear, and timely. The recipient in love, humility and with care should listen to what is being said, trying to understand where the communicator is coming from without reacting – clarifying with questions if needed. Upon receiving the message, the recipient should then ponder before answering and continue using these biblical principles." (Stuart Scott)
