Mark's Gospel—Jesus' True Identity Reveals the Magnitude of His Sacrifice

10:30 Morning Worship Service:

Mark 1:12-20

His Kingdom Is Now

Jesus is the Fulfillment of God's Kingdom Good News.

Jesus Is the King Who ...

1. ... Passes the Test (12-13).

2. ... Fulfills the Gospel of God (14-15).

3. ... Forms a New Band of Brothers, Fishers of Men (16-20).

Conclusion: Deliverance and judgment come together. When the police arrive it is good news for the victim and terrifying for the robber. Same event. Very different consequences. Mark is heralding the wondrous good news for the repentant that the King has come. It is to the great relief to the downtrodden in Rome who are being fed to the lions and other wild animals. It is the declaration of the end to those who are persecuting them. What does this declaration mean to us now? How will it change you?

Exodus 6:1-9

But the LORD said to Moses, "Now you shall see what I will do to Pharaoh; for with a strong hand he will send them out, and with a strong hand he will drive them out of his land." ²God spoke to Moses and said to him, "I am the LORD. ³I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, as God Almighty, but by my name the LORD I did not make myself known to them. 4 I also established my covenant with them to give them the land of Canaan, the land in which they lived as sojourners. 5 Moreover, I have heard the groaning of the people of Israel whom the Egyptians hold as slaves, and I have remembered my covenant. ⁶ Say therefore to the people of Israel, 'I am the LORD, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will deliver you from slavery to them, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great acts of judgment. ⁷ I will take you to be my people, and I will be your God, and you shall know that I am the LORD your God, who has brought you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians. ⁸ I will bring you into the land that I swore to give to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob. I will give it to you for a possession. I am the LORD ." 9 Moses spoke thus to the people of Israel, but they did not listen to Moses, because of their broken spirit and harsh slavery.

Amos 4:1-3

"Hear this word, you cows of Bashan, who are on the mountain of Samaria, who oppress the poor, who crush the needy,

who say to your husbands, 'Bring, that we may drink!'

- ² The Lord God has sworn by his holiness that, behold, the days are coming upon you, when they shall take you away with hooks, even the last of you with fishhooks.
- ³ And you shall go out through the breaches, each one straight ahead; and you shall be cast out into Harmon," declares the LORD.

Hebrews 3:1-11

Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, ² who was faithful to him who appointed him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God's house. ³ For Jesus has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses—as much more glory as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself. ⁴ (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) ⁵ Now Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant, to testify to the things that were to be spoken later, ⁶ but Christ is faithful over God's house as a son. And we are his house, if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope.

- ⁷ Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says, "Today, if you hear his voice,
- ⁸ do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion, on the day of testing in the wilderness,
- ⁹ where your fathers put me to the test and saw my works for *forty years*.
- ¹⁰ Therefore I was provoked with that generation, and said,
- 'They always go astray in their heart; they have not known my ways.'
- ¹¹ As I swore in my wrath, 'They shall not enter my rest.'"

Taking Gathered Worship Home

The Good News is that the King of Justice and Mercy has come as He promised. He has brought both deliverance for the captive and defeat for the captor. Jesus is the fulfillment of the Gospel of God.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday Morning

READ Mark 1:12-20; Exodus 6:1-9; Hebrews 3:1-4; Amos 4:1-3; 1 Corinthians 15:42-49; Psalm 21:1-13. DISCUSS What do these actions of Jesus reveal about who He is? Why is His identity so significant? What time is it now that this One has arrived doing these things? How are you responding? SERVE someone in need. MEDITATE on 1 Corinthians 15:56-58. PRAY "Father God, You know exactly what time it is and what is appropriate at each hour. Thank You for the mercy You have lavished on us, Your people."

Sunday Evening

Young Adult Fellowship meets at 6pm in the church library (back door).

Monday

READ Mark 1:12-20; Exodus 6:1-9; Psalm 21:1-13. DISCUSS When God delivered Israel what did that mean for Egypt? How does the King's coming bring both deliverance and damnation? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on 1 Corinthians 15:56-58. PRAY, "Jesus, Thank You for faithfully coming as You promised. Thank You for *mercy when we deserve judgment*."

Tuesday

READ Mark 1:12-20; Hebrews 3:1-4; 4:5-6; Psalm 21:1-13. DISCUSS Who failed the test in the wilderness? Who passed it? SERVE by considering someone else's needs *above your own!* MEDITATE on 1 Corinthians 15:56-58. PRAY, "Lord Jesus, thank You for conquering where we had failed. We praise and adore You, Jesus!"

Wednesday

READ Mark 1:12-20; Amos 4:1-3; Psalm 21:1-13. DISCUSS How is the imagery for fishing used in the Bible? SERVE by *caring about someone else* more than yourself! MEDITATE on 1 Corinthians 15:56-58. PRAY, "Holy Spirit, thank You for giving us eyes to see and ears to hear the wonder of the gospel of the Kingdom of God!"

Thursday

READ Mark 1:12-20; 1 Corinthians 15:42-49; Psalm 21:1-13. DISCUSS Who is the last Adam? How has He rescued us? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own!* MEDITATE on 1 Corinthians 15:56-58. PRAY, "Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we praise You for Your work in our salvation!"

Friday

READ Mark 1:12-20; Exodus 6:1-9; Hebrews 3:1-4; Amos 4:1-3; 1 Corinthians 15:42-49; Psalm 21:1-13. DISCUSS, What has the Holy Spirit been teaching you this week through these passages? MEDITATE on 1 Corinthians 15:56-58. PRAY that we at FCCW would be transformed together by God's Word through Mark.

Saturday

PREPARE for *gathered worship tomorrow*. READ **Mark 1:1-45**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the *worship service* @ **10:30**. Ask Jesus to reveal Himself to us in His Word by His Spirit.

Meditate on this—1 Corinthians 15:56-58

"The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But *thanks be* to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."
