Introduction:-Getting haircut – not interested in the stimulating magazines.
-Lab/test results. Often find ourselves waiting. Disciples are told to wait.Background:Who waited, and Where? Apostles, Women, Mary and Jesus' brothers – in
and "upper room"

I. "Waiting" time is not wasted time – if we use it well.

- A. Devoted to Worship and Prayer
 - 1. Worship Luke 24:53 Where did we leave off?
 - 2. Prayer
 - a. They were <u>devoting</u> themselves to prayer persevering in prayer
 - From "proskatereo" constant, busy, persistent used in 2:42 & 6:4
 - 2) Not driven to prayer by crisis but by promise!
 - b. They were <u>United</u> in Prayer. Of "one accord."
 - 1) "together" from *homothumadon*" "united" Acts 4:24; 15:25; Romans 15:6
 - c. Prayer Brought them together *relationally*
 - d. Bound them together spiritually

ASIDE/APPLICATION: Session seeking to define our mission and goals *so that* – we are "homothumadon" "all together" "in one accord" "in unity of purpose and in prayer".

e. With clear direction in prayer! They knew exactly what they were praying for.

NOTE: God's promise, His sovereign plan does not preclude or render prayer needless or useless. On the contrary, it gives us every reason to pray with confidence, conviction and boldness – because we know this is the prayer he will hear and answer!

- B. Preparation for what lies ahead.
 - 1. The Need?? **Death of Judas.** He was one of the 12. He was no longer with them. *The scriptures foretold it!*
 - a. Peter has become a spokesman.
 - b. Luke explains to Gentile readers 18-19, "parenthesis"
 - 2. The Warrant/Reason (to fill his place?) "To fulfill the scriptures"
 - a. The *Testimony* of Scripture -16,17 OT "testimonies" were texts which found fulfillment in Christ and later in the ministry of the church.
 - 1) Psalms were interpreted in a messianic sense (especially "royal" Psalms 2, 22, 72)

I. "Waiting" time is not wasted time – if we use it well. (continued)

- B. Preparation for what lies ahead.
 - 2. The Warrant/Reason (to fill his place?)
 - a. The *Testimony* of Scripture
 - Jesus the Messiah is of David's line. Acts 4:25-28; John 13:18 Jesus quotes Ps.41:9 in announcing a traitor in their midst.
 - b. Judas must be replaced. Psalms 69:25; Ps. 109:8 **The appeal was to the scriptures interpreted in the light of Christ revealed.** Luke 24:27; John 5:39, 40
 - c. The testimony of the Savior Luke 22:28-30
 - d. And of Paul 1 Corinthinas 15:8,9
 - 3. Matthias is Chosen
 - a. The requirements? Essential Qualifications:
 - 1) With them from the time of John's Baptism of Jesus
 - 2) Witness *of* the Resurrection and Ascension
 - b. God does the choosing!! Proverbs 16:33 They were preparing so they were ready when God would give them the Holy Spirit .
- **II. Waiting is often in God's plan**. We might say it *is* God's plan.
 - A. It is Hard Work!
 - 1. Examples of the Saints??
 - 2. We all must learn to wait on God for him to fulfill his perfect plans To finish the work he has begun in us – to bring glory to himself through the lives of his saints.

Waiting is Hard Work. It is seeking – praying – and preparing for what God will yet do.

B. Wait in a manner that bears fruit. Isaiah 40

III. Learn to Wait Well.

- A. Waiting for His plans for us to be revealed. Pray for Christ to be revealed in us and through us. Prepare you hearts & minds to be ready to give Him glory when
 - the test results come in
 - the trial hits home
 - sorrow overtakes you
 - when you are sinned against
 - when the hope and promise of the gospel is rejected
- B. Waiting for His return? Pray for His coming. Let us never stop preparing for that day!
