### A Universal Truth or a Devotional Thought

(Chapter and Verse Please)

Why is it so hard to distinguish between our convictions and God's Word?

Have you ever held a conviction, that you thought was right, that you thought was from the Bible but as you grew in Christ you found out that was not the case?

Many of us teach from the basis of our own convictions, perspecives and feelings as to what God says and feels on an issue. Instead of starting here, with a verse, stories and examples and our own strong feelings, we were to go and study the Bilble on the subject. It would take mush more time. How would the use of the Bible slow your teaching down?

How would the use of the Bible motivate you in the area of scripture memory?

#### I. It is important to distinguish between God's Word and our thoughts.

- A. The exposition of a passage
  - 1. Find the meaning of exposition as it applies to the teaching of a Bible?
  - 2. How does the discipline protect us from error?

#### B. VS. The support of our thoughts with a passage.

- 1. What would be an example of having a conviction and then going to the Bible and finding a verse to support it, yet still being wrong?
- **2.** How is this misused in the church today?
- 3. As the Word of God becomes more and more embarrassing to the Evangelical Pragmatists and less and less necessary to the Evangelical Mystics, we will see a decline in exposition and an explosion in "scripture springboards". The use of a verse to spring board into what we want to talk about. On the radio, in books and from the pulpit, what is done more verse by verse exposition or a passage followed by endless stories and truisms?

How does the phrase in I Corinthians 4:6 "Now these things, brethren, I have figuratively applied to myself and Apollos for your sakes, that in us you might learn not to exceed what is written, in order that no one of you might become arrogant in behalf of one against the other." # II. We cannot use the teaching and/or preaching found in the Historical Revelation of the Bible as our guide.

#### A. Example – Jesus and the Old Testament

Did Jesus quote verses to establish His teachings?

Did Jesus use parables and stories without quoting the Bible?

Since Jesus is out example, why can't we do the same thing?

- 1. It is often pointed out that Jesus began with a passage and then took it to it's current application in modern culture
- 2. Or that He inserted Old Testament passages into His sermons to make them relevant to His speakers.
- 3. This view of Christ and the Word of God fails to take into account...
  - a. He is God
  - b. He at that time was the Word of God incarnate
  - c. All that He did and said was God's actions and God's Word
  - d. How is Jesus' teaching on a subject different from yours?

#### **B.** Example – The Apostle Paul...

Reflect on the ministry of Paul...

Did Paul quote the Bible every time he dealt with a current issue in the churches?

Did Paul use contemporary examples in his sermons?

Some of Paul's letters contain no quotes from the Bible of that day, others contain a quote but he obviously builds upon it as a "spring board" to current issues. Why can't we do the same thing?

#### Paul and Sermon on Mars Hill – Read Acts 17:22 - 31

- 1. It is often pointed out that Paul used no scripture in his sermon on Mars Hill.
- 2. Did Moses use scripture in the writing of the Law?
- 3. Did Jeremiah or Isaiah use scripture in the giving of thier prophecies?
- 4. Luke, in recording Paul's sermon on Mars Hill, was doing so under the divine authorship of whom?
- 5. Paul, was an apostle, and as such spoke on the divine inspiration of whom?
- 6. What does the sermon on Mars Hill have in common with Moses on Mt. Siania and Jesus' Sermon on the Mount?
- 7. Why is it wrong to say "Paul quoted no scsripture during his sermon on Mars Hill."
- 8. According to II Timothy 3:16 and I Thessalonians 2:13, what was every word of Paul's on Mars Hill?

III. In our approach to the Word of God it is important to submit our thoughts and convictions to the Word of God. Read the passages and then give them an principle as it pertains to subjecting our teaching to the Word of God.
