Mark 4: 35-41

Storm Facts:

1. Storms often come at **inconvenient** times. v. 35a “That day when evening came . . .”
2. Storms can happen when we’re **obeying** the Lord. v. 35b “. . .he (Jesus) said to his disciples, “Let us go over to the other side.”
3. Storms come when we’re **close** to the Lord. v. 36a “Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat.”
