## Praise Befits the Upright Psalm 33

**Introduction:** God is concerned with how He is worshipped

**Context**: Psalm 33 is the expression of pure praise from those whose

transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered ...

against whom the Lord counts no iniquity (Psalm 32:1-2)

A call to worship (1-3): Five imperatives (require freshness, skill and fervor)

Shout joyfully give thanks make melody (using instruments) sing to him a new song (Revelation 5:9, 14:2-3) play skillfully

To refuse to sing with the assembly is sinful

## The motivation for praise (4-11)

God's character (4-5) – he loves righteousness and justice

God's creative power (6-9) – he spoke and it came to be

God's enduring purpose (10-11) – the counsel of the Lord stands forever

## Though it is the duty of all people to praise God, only some do (8-18):

God's "general look": All people are under God's sovereign rule and responsible to praise Him

God's "specific look": Only God's own people will truly praise Him

## We can hope and trust in God (19-22)

Deliverance comes to those who wait for it, hopefully

**Application**: Let's Praise God loudly for He alone is worthy!
