ELISHA SAVES THE STEW

FEEDING A CROWD IN A TIME OF FAMINE: 2 Kings 4:38-44

- I. FAMINE IN THE REGION (38)
 - A. Fallen World (Gen 3:17-19)—the ground cursed because of Adam's sin
 - **B.** <u>Serious Stress</u>—stress to provide for your family, to eat or not to eat!
 - **C.** <u>Fatherly Care</u> (Mat 4:4; 6:9, 11, 31-34)—we are not orphans; God is also Father to the fathers
 - 1. Taking Responsibility (Ps 33:18-19)
 - 2. Providing Physical Food (Mat 7:9-11)
 - 3. Providing Spiritual Instruction (Mat 4:4)
- II. DEATH IN THE POT (38-41; Mk 16:18)—miracle of *quality*; making the poisonous edible
 - A. The Problem of Poison (Deut 32:32-33)—the Fall; honest mistake can be deadly
 - 1. Deadly
 - 2. Bad-tasting
 - 3. Unfit for consumption
 - B. The Challenge of Potluck—community fellowship, the church
 - **1.** Culinary Chaos—too many people adding ingredients
 - **2.** Accidental Offenses—my contribution is not appreciated or causes harm
 - **3.** Ethnic Cuisine (Rom 11:17; Act 10:9-17)—metaphor for inclusion of Gentiles in the church
 - C. The Grace of Gravy (Mk 16:18)
 - 1. The gospel of grace is able to unify the church in love. (1 Pet 4:8)
 - 2. The sweetness of grace is more powerful than the bitterness of offense. (Mk 16:18)
 - 3. Sharing life in community is messy and fraught with risk—Do it anyway.
 - →Sprinkle the grace of God into any stew in which you find yourself!

- III. MEAL FOR A HUNDRED (42-44; Mat 14:15-21; 15:32-38)—miracle of *quantity*
 - **A.** <u>The Problem</u> (43)—not enough to feed everyone
 - 1. I don't have enough.—food, money, time, etc...
 - 2. <u>I am</u> not enough.—my wisdom, strength, skill, personality, emotional energy...
 - → God looks at what we have, not at what we don't have.
 - **B.** <u>The Provision</u>—God is always enough!
 - **1.** A Providential Gift (42)—your gift means more than you know.
 - **2.** A <u>Miraculous</u> Multiplication (44)—a gift multiplies in the sharing.
 - 3. A Good Meal
 - **a.** Adequate—nothing fancy but it is wholesome and nutritious
 - **b.** Enough—everyone had their fill
 - **c. Generous**—more than enough, even enough for left-overs (43-44)
 - **4.** A <u>Comforting Promise</u> (Gen 22:14; Mat 16:8-10)—*The Lord will provide*.
 - a. For those who are seeking His kingdom and righteousness. (Mat 6:33)
 - b. For those who share with His people. (Phil 4:19)
 - c. What we need to minister to others. (Lk 11:5-6)
- IV. The Ultimate Prophet (Deut 18:15, 18; Acts 3:22).
 - A. Resemblance to the Great Prophets
 - 1. Miracles of healing what is bitter
 - 2. Miracles of providing food
 - **3.** <u>Teaching</u> <u>Ministry</u>—training disciples and teaching others
 - **B.** Surpassing All Other Prophets
 - 1. More miracles and greater
 - **2. Undoing the Curse**—He is able to restore the blessing of creation.
 - 3. The Everlasting Father
 - a. The Fatherhood of Adam (what it should have been)
 - **b.** The Fatherhood of God (what it is)
