I. ABRAHAM WAS JUSTIFIED BY FAITH AND LIVED BY FAITH

A. Abraham Was JUSTIFIED by FAITH without Works or Rituals. (Romans 4:1-12)

1. Paul uses Abraham as a biblical example of how a sinner is justified _____.(4:1-2)

Biblically: _____ means “declared to be righteous before God.” It is a technical term used in a court room by a judge to “declare a person righteous – without guilt and in right standing before the court.”

B. Abraham LIVED by FAITH. (Heb. 11:8-19)

II. ABRAHAM LEARNED IN GOD’S SCHOOL OF FAITH

A. The BEGINNING of Abraham’s WALK of FAITH – By faith, Abram believes God’s Word and leaves Ur, without knowing exactly where God will lead him. (Genesis 11:31–12:9; Hebrews 11:8)

B. The PROCESS of Learning to WALK By FAITH.

Every Christian will go through various events, circumstances and trials in their life that God will use to bring them to spiritual maturity. Below are four things that God allowed into Abraham's life to use to trust God.

1. Test of _____ – A famine in the land; Abraham does not live by faith, but walks by sight and goes down to Egypt. (12:10)
 - Do you ever wait upon God by faith to show you His will? (Ex. 14:13; 2Chron. 20:17; Ps. 27:14, 37:34, 46:10; Prov. 3:5-7; Is. 40:29-31; Acts 16:6-10; Col. 4:3; Rev. 3:7-8)

2. Test of _____ – In Egypt, Abram did not trust the Lord, but for his own selfish protection he lies about Sarai being his sister to the authorities. Yet, by his grace God protects and preserves Sarai in the Pharaoh's harem. (12:11-20, 20:1-18)
 - Do you ever try to manipulate your circumstances for selfish gain or self justification?

3. Test of _____ – Lot walks by sight and selfishly chooses the best land, while pitching his tent toward Sodom. Abram walks by faith and is re-assured of God's promise of a land, a seed, and blessing. (Gen. 13:1-18) Lot is a carnal believer making decisions based upon his sin nature and not by faith in God's Word. (Rom. 8:5-8; 1Cor. 2:14-3:4)
 - What is your greatest enemy in "walking by faith"?

4. Test of _____ – Abram and Sarai were not able to have children for many years and the trial tested their faith repeatedly. (15:1-6, 16:1-18:15)
 - Does God understand your every personal struggle and disappointment?

5. Test of _____ – Abraham was commanded by God to offer his only son Isaac as a sacrifice. (Gen. 22:1-18)
 - What are you willing to sacrifice to fulfill God's perfect will in your life?
