The Sufficiency of Scripture

Bibliology is the study of the Bible, the Word of God.

Characteristics of Scripture: 1. Authority of Scripture 2. Inspiration of Scripture 3. Inerrancy of Scripture 4. Sufficiency of Scripture

Definition: The *sufficiency of Scripture* means that Scripture contained all the words of God He intended His people to have at each stage of redemptive history, and that it now contains all the words of God we need for salvation, for trusting Him perfectly, and for obeying Him perfectly.

Key Verses—Psalm 19:7-10

Psalm 19:7-10 “The law of the LORD *is* perfect, converting the soul; The testimony of the LORD *is* sure, making wise the simple; ⁸ The statutes of the LORD *are* right, rejoicing the heart; The commandment of the LORD *is* pure, enlightening the eyes; ⁹ The fear of the LORD *is* clean, enduring forever; The judgments of the LORD *are* true *and* righteous altogether. ¹⁰ More to be desired *are they* than gold, Yea, than much fine gold; Sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb.”
