Introduction: Theft defined according to expediency not God's word

- I. What the 8<sup>th</sup> commandment assumes (3 Things)
  - A. Assumes the right to own personal property
  - B. Assumes voluntary, not compulsory giving and sharing
  - C. God's Creation as an analog to Man's creation
- II. The Ethic of the 8<sup>th</sup> Commandment
  - A. The Violation of the 8th commandment begins with the Violation of the 10th commandment
  - B. How do we break the 8th commandment? (4 general areas)
    - 1. Taking anything that is not yours is theft, whether it is of little or great value.
    - 2. Squandering our time is theft.
    - 3. Stealing from God (Mal 3:8-10)
    - 4. Refusing to give glory to God where it is due is theft
- III. How does salvation change this?
  - 1. First, it pardons us of the guilt and penalty of sin.
  - 2. But second, it redeems us from the Gollum-like slavery to stuff for the sake of stuff by giving us a new attitude toward the products of our work (Eph 4:28)
