And if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold." ⁹ And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰ For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."



A Most Curious Story, 1-10

- Zacchaeus' curiosity, 1-4
 - o His background
 - o What he did
 - o Risk
- Four questions
 - o What was Zacchaeus' motivation?
 - o What was his intended outcome?
 - o What did the world see?
 - o What did Jesus see?
- · A Stunning Summons, 5
 - o Jesus' interaction
 - o Shows divine knowledge

- · Zacchaeus' Surprising Conversion, 6

 - o The world's grumbling for now...
- Two declarations
 - o Zacchaeus, 8
 - § Hearing grumbling, he makes a stunning announcement
 - § Evidence of a changed life
 - § Half... and four-fold
 - · Law: 20%
 - Means at the most only 10% of what he had could have been gained unfairly (100 = 50 + 4x + X)
 - o Jesus, 9
- · Jesus' Mission Statement, Verse 10.
 - o Seek and save the Lost; Compare with Matthew 20.28, Mark 10.45
 - o Mission statement for his ministry comes from his Vision for his ministry, cf. John 3.16; Hebrews 10.5-7; John 17.4
- What is vision?
 - o The ability to see things as God intends them to be in contrast to the way things are. (Cortez Cooper)
 - § Jesus' vision: Habakkuk 2.14; Revelation 11.15
 - o The typical Jewish vision in Jesus' day: an earthly kingdom

o Zacchaeus' vision aligns with Jesus' heart: Gives money over and above what's required to draw attention to Jesus- that Jesus had changed (saved) him, and hence can change (save) others

Faith Promise Giving: Giving above our regular tithes for the purpose of missions- supporting cross-cultural missionaries, church planters, and campus ministries, all with the goal of making disciples of all nations.

· Faith Promise giving is investing our resources in the proclamation of the Kingdom of God... to seek and save the lost

The Parable, 11-27

- Lots going on in this parable look at again in four weeks; we are particularly interested in their engagement until Jesus comes
- · Clarity: Jesus tells it because they are expecting the Kingdom of God to come immediately in all its fullness- a kingdom that is an expansion of the earthly kingdom of Israel with Jerusalem as its capital.
 - o Some expecting Jesus to bring it about immediately.
- Main points
 - o The kingdom is not immediate.... time delay... Jesus going away for an indefinite period of time
 - o Hostility towards Jesus and his mission will continue
 - o Followers of Jesus are entrusted with the Father's resources and are expected to engage in business
 - § The King has high expectations of us
 - § Where our treasure is, there will our hearts be also.

Making a Faith Promise Investment

- · It's about our hearts
- Where does the money come from?
 - o Sacrifice Unexpected source Special project
- How do we decide an amount?
 - o Contemplate what God has done for us
 - o Pray
 - o Pray for God's provision-giving to missions will increase our praying

So What About Us?

- · Jesus sees the world differently than you or I do. Nobody in Jericho that day thought that Zacchaeus would be getting into the kingdom of God. Nobody. Not even Zacchaeus kidded himself about that.
- · We must align our hearts with his heart
- · Without a vision for how things could be, there is little incentive for Faith Promise giving investment, let alone praying and going
- Our gratitude and belief in God's promises motivate our giving.
- · We are held accountable for how we use our resources.
- "I will place no value on anything I have or may possess, except in relation to the kingdom of Christ. If anything will advance the interests of that kingdom, it shall be given away or kept, only as by giving or keeping it I shall most promote the glory of Him to whom I owe all my hopes in time and eternity." (Robert Moffat)
