Series: John

Sermon: John 1:29-34

1. Did Jesus have to die to provide forgiveness of sins, or could He have just shed a drop of blood to provide forgiveness of sins? How does God's commandments for past sacrifices help to answer this question? See Hebrews 9:22-26 as well.

2. John the Baptist is an extremely important person in the Apostle John's explanation and introduction of Jesus. How would you explain the importance of John the Baptist to a Christian who was unaware, or unlearned about him?

3. Many people were confused about whether or not Jesus was the Messiah, due to Him not meeting their preconceived expectations. Did the great John the Baptist struggle with some of this as well? See Matthew 11:1-3

What message did Jesus pass on to John the Baptist to strengthen his faith, and how would this have been helpful? See Matthew 11:4

4. It is sad, but at the same time refreshing, to see that even the Great Herald of the Messiah, struggled and needed reminded of the truths that he already knew. Has your faith ever struggled because of unmet expectations of God? Anyone willing to share? (If not, everyone just nod your head.) How would you encourage a fellow believer in such a faith crisis?

5. Christians suffering persecution was quite common in the New Testament and at various times and places ever since. Many people seem to struggle with the "Why" of their persecution and suffering, kind of like John the Baptist did. How might John the Baptist's story, 1 Peter 4:15-16,19, and Phil. 1:27-30 help to develop a more Biblical view of suffering?
