



“The Lord God”

Like No Other
Deuteronomy 4:25-40

He evokes:

I. Wariness – “to provoke Him to anger” (vs. 25-31)

About who we:

- A. Serve** - “there ye shall serve gods, the work of men’s hands”
- B. Seek** – “if thou seek Him with all thy heart and...all thy soul”
- C. Submit** – “shalt be obedient unto His voice”

II. Wonder – “the Lord thy God is a merciful God” (vs. 32-38)

About the God of:

- A. Creation** - “since the day that God created man upon the earth”
- B. Communication** – “Did ever people hear the voice of God”
- C. Constancy** – “He will not forsake thee”

III. Worship – “consider it in thine heart...He is God” (vs. 39-40)

About the greatest:

- A. Author** - “the Lord He is God in Heaven...and upon the earth”
- B. Authority** – “Thou shalt keep therefore His statutes”
- C. Advocate** – “which the Lord thy God gives thee, forever”
