


## **Definition of Theory**


#### Scientific

"body of interconnected concepts, supported by <u>scientific reasoning</u> and <u>experimental evidence</u> that explains the facts in some area of study" or "that of which we are most certain" (Raven, 2004)

Colloquial

implies a lack of knowledge or a guess (Raven, 2004)





### **Criteria for Scientific Theory**

As articulated by US Supreme Court (Daubert vs Merrell Dow Pharmaceuticals, 1993)

- ... the methods <u>must yield testable predictions</u> by means of which the theory <u>could be falsified</u> (scientific method).
- The methods should preferably be <u>published in a</u> <u>peer-reviewed journal.</u>
- There should be a <u>known rate of error</u> that can be used in evaluating the results.
- The methods should be <u>generally accepted within</u> <u>the scientific community.</u>



### **Methodological Naturalism**

AFFIRMS	the existence of a type of rationality in nature that can be understood by man
AFFIRMS	that all religion is a product of man's reflection upon his experience
DENIES	the existence of historical (empirical, special) revelation
DENIES	that rationality can be maintained if divine intervention is allowed in nature


# Logical Fallacy of Scientific Induction


- If "p", then "q"

*"assertion of the consequent" or "the generalization fallacy"* 








### **Longevity Decline after the Flood**

# The "Babel Temptation"

- 1. Lack of faith by people and leadership in God's design & providence
- 2. Rejection of transcendent ethical standards above the State
- 3. Using coercive lethal power of civil authority to create a counterfeit Kingdom of God (State transformed from a preservative institution into a redemptive institution)

"Raised up by God to declare normative religion, it has been assailed from its beginning and repeatedly threatened with destruction and corruption, but God has graciously and miraculously preserved both the books of its content (the Old Testament) and the people as its bearer (Israel). Indeed the Old Testament is a missionary book and Israel a missionary people....a channel, not a storehouse, of blessing"

The "Heathen Problem" (1) NT says LJC is only way of salvation (2) NT says "great commission" (3) Vast numbers haven't heard the NT gospel message (4) Christianity is unjust to insist that no one can be saved who hasn't heard the NT gospel message


God creates nature and man <u>as nature's</u> <u>interpreter</u> by language so that knowledge of God is the <u>starting point</u> for all predication

C-to-c revelation

#### GOD Perfection of Q (but He

is "simple" = not made of "parts"; Q are modes of existence, not things)

God's attribute of Q can be known by <u>analogy</u> because all creation, including q, has been given <u>revelatory</u> <u>significance</u> according to biblical revelation



Thomas Aquinas' doctrine of "analogy"

The meaning of "Q" ascribed to God by the creature man who has only the experience of imperfect Q

"Univocal": identical meaning "Equivocal": utterly different meaning "Analogical": similar meaning (but how can *any* concept/form be abstracted from God as they are from creature objects?)

### A Protestant Anti-Catholic Creed

"God, without any merit of mine, of mere grace, grants and imputes to me the perfect satisfaction, righteousness, and holiness of Christ, as if I had never had nor committed any sin, and myself had accomplished all the obedience which Christ rendered for me." Heidelberg Catechism - 1563

### **A Roman-Catholic Creed**

"If they were not born again in Christ, they would never be justified, since in that new birth there is bestowed upon them, through the merit of His passion, the grace whereby they are made just. . . justification is not only the bare remission of sins, but also sanctification and renewal of the inner man. . The ban is placed on any who teach that man is justified through imputation of the righteousness of Christ. . .exclusive of the grace and love which is infused into the heart through the Holy Spirit."

Council of Trent 1545-1563

### Faith = Assurance

"It is a firm and sure knowledge of divine favor toward us, founded on the truth of a free promise in Christ, and revealed to our minds, and sealed in our hearts, by the Holy Spirit. . . .When we so examine ourselves, however, it is not to see whether our holiness, our works, or the fruit of the Spirit in our lives warrant assurance of salvation. Rather, it is to determine that such assurance rests on the proper foundation of God's mercy in Christ." Calvin
