# Living In Reality (Which Is Better?)

Ecclesiastes 7:1-12

### I. <u>THE CERTAINTY OF DEATH</u> (1-2, 4) —

#### A. The Facing of Fear

- <u>The Loss of a Loved One</u>
  a. They are <u>not God</u>.
  - b. Don't take them for granted.

#### 2. <u>Our Own Mortality</u>—Someday that will be <u>me</u> in the casket.

B. <u>The Perspective on Life</u>—that only death can provide

**1.** <u>Your Good Name</u> (1a)—cultivated over a lifetime of relationships and behavior

- 2. <u>Your Limited Time</u> (5:18; Ps 90:12)—life is short, live intentionally
- 3. <u>Your Final Destiny</u> ()—the grave (under the sun)
- C. <u>The Benefit of Mourning</u> (2 Cor 7:8-9)

**1. Grieving loss is an appropriate response to reality** (Jn 11:35; Lk 19:41) —no longer in Eden and not yet in Heaven

**2.** Sharing someone else's grief is a comfort to them (Isa 53; Rom 12:15) part of life in community

**3.** The path to joy is *through* grief, not *around* it. (Mat 5:4; Rev 21:4). *Jesus is the comfort of God.* 

## II. THE FORMING OF CHARACTER (3-7)—

- A. <u>The Benefit of Sorrow</u> (3-4)— God is shaping our character.
- B. <u>The Benefit of Rebuke</u> (5-6; Ps 145:5; Pro 12:1; 13:20; 15:5)
  - 1. The Song of Fools
    - a. Entertainment—distraction from what is necessary, important.
    - **b.** Flattery—singing your praises, causing you to overlook your faults and think too highly of yourself

#### 2. The <u>Laughter</u> of Fools

- a. Denial—making light of serious things
- b. Inappropriate Humor—crude, base, degenerate, or cruel
- c. Scoffing—unbelief, mocking what is important or sacred,
- 3. A <u>Rebuke</u> from the Wise ()—it improves you
- C. <u>The Danger of Corruption</u> (7)
  - Extortion/oppression) (Isa 57:11; Pro 29:25; Lk 12:4-5)—coercion by fear
    Blackmail
    - b. Threat of Harm
  - 2. <u>Bribery</u> ()—seduction of greed
- III. THE PROVIDENCE OF GOD (8-10; Rom 8:28)—
  - A. <u>The End or the Beginning</u> (8a; 1 Cor 4:5)
  - B. Patience or Pride (8b-9)
  - C. Nostalgia for the Old Days (10)

## IV. THE ADVANTAGE OF WISDOM (11-12)—

- A. Wisdom guards and maintains the quality of life
  - 1. Money is a resource.
  - 2. Wisdom knows what to do with it.

**B.** <u>Wisdom orders your priorities in this life</u> (in light of death) because it **orients** you to something **beyond** this life *under the sun.* 

- 1. It considers death.
- 2. It values character.
- 3. It manages <u>time</u>.

We will never find this joy until we understand the true condition of the world under the sun, the certain reality of death, the true desperation of our hearts. (Pro 10:28; Ps 4:7; Neh 8:10; Lk 2:10; Jn 15:11; Gal 5:22; 1 Pet 1;8; Rom 14:17)
