## Trials and Temptations

Trial: At first glance looks undesirable, but can lead to something good.

- A trial, rightly handled, enhances our walk of faith.

Temptation: At first glance looks desirable, but can lead to something terrible.

- A temptation, wrongly handled, impairs our walk of faith and leads to sin.
- God never tempts a believer to sin.


## Count:

- When we count, we take in more than the apparent situation.

Joy: Happiness that is dependent on Jesus rather than circumstances.

Vr. 3 "for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness."
