Romans 8:26–27 Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. <sup>27</sup> And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

Supplication (deēsis): plea; beg; that which is asked with urgency based on presumed need

Keep alert (agrypneō): keep awake; keep alert; Spiritually, to be watchful and attentive to spiritual things

Perseverance (proskarterēsis): to devote ones self too; to keep on; to persist in despite difficulty.

Luke 18:1 And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart.

Praying for the Saints

Ephesians 3:14–19 For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, <sup>15</sup> from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, <sup>16</sup> that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, <sup>17</sup> so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, <sup>18</sup> may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, <sup>19</sup> and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.
