First Love Lost and Found Revelation 2:1-7 Reading: Revelation 1:4-8

Bethany Baptist Church February 4, 2018 (a.m.) We've just finished Paul's letter to the *Ephesians*!

Written in **62 AD**. Full of <u>truth</u> for the church.

Truth to make a church strong!

But did you know there is *another* letter to the Ephesians in your **NT?**

Written 30 years later & penned by the apostle *John*, **not** by *Paul*.

What do you suppose can happen to a *good church* as the *first generation* ages and the *next generation* or *so* comes on the scene? Will it be *good* or *bad*...?

What threatens a *good*, *old* church?

Read Rev 2:1-7

John is an old man. But the *Emperor Domition* has exiled this dangerous old apostle to the *Isle of Patmos*.

There on Patmos, Jesus comes to the faithful old saint with all kinds visions.

Visions of things that were, of things that are, & mostly of things that will be.

Early in *Revelation*, Jesus dictates *seven* short *letters* to *seven* typical *churches*.

Some *good*...some *not so much*.

Jesus' first letter was to the church in Ephesus. As we've already seen, a pretty good church!

But this morning we're going to see...

Why a good church *might not be* good enough:

vv.1-2 - The Lord knows every church.

vv.2-3, 6 - The Lord appreciates our good

v.4 - But He also sees what's bad

v.5 - And the Lord has a remedy for our greatest need

v.7 - Which means there is hope – we can overcome our threats

The Lord knows our church (read vv.1-2)

- 1. There was a lot of incredible *imagery* in John's *visions*, and that *carries over* into the **seven** *letters*. You can see it in this *intriguing introduction*:
 - a. The *angel of the church* is best understood as symbolic of its *elder*(s)
 the *pastors* of the Ephesian congregation.
- 2. More importantly, however, is "The One."
 - a. You can probably *guess* who He is, and a look back *confirms* that this letter is from the *Son of Man* Jesus (**1:13**). What do we *know* about *Jesus* & His *relationship* to the Church? He is the Church's ...
 - i. Redeemer He purchased her w/ His blood,
 - ii. Head we grow as a body **up** & **into** Him,
 - iii. *Husband* who loves His *bride* perfectly & sacrificially
 - iv. *Cornerstone* we are built up, as *living stones*, from our *foundation & cornerstone*.
 - v. Builder (Mt 16) "on this rock I will **build** My church."
 - vi. The *Son of Man* is the *Lord of His Church* therefore, Christ has the right to *speak* to the church.
 - b. Friend, a church w/ **no** real *connection* to Jesus is **no** real *church*!
- 3. Jesus immediately *identifies* Himself w/ **four** *simple* but *powerful* actions; He is "The One" who:
 - **a.** *Holds* The *Son of Man holds the seven stars in His* <u>right</u> hand. I see **two** *levels* of imagery here:
 - **i. Read 1:20.** The *seven stars* are the *seven angels* (2:1) & the *angels* are the churches' *elders/pastors* (1:20).
 - **ii.** Jesus is *holding* (present tense) the congregation's *leadership* in His *right hand* (i.e. *strong hand*).
 - iii. The Son of Man is *identifying* Himself as a picture of *strong* & *constant protection* for the *elders* & thus the *church*.

- **b.** Walks The Son of Man walks among the seven golden lampstands. As we just read in 1:20, the lampstands are the churches.
 - i. Golden speaks to the precious value of Jesus' churches.
 - **ii.** Lampstand reminds us that our mission is to illumine a dark world w/ gospel light!
 - **iii.** Christ is *near us*! Our Lord is *walking among us* (present tense) for our *protection*, but also our *accountability*.
- **c.** Says/speaks The Son of Man is near w/a message. He is building & leading & speaking to His people.
- **d.** *Knows* Jesus says, "*I know your deeds*." Here is a verb that is *not* in the *present tense*. The grammar of "*I know*" (2a Gr. *perfect* tense) indicates that Jesus *knows* us & has *always* known us from the start He knows us *perfectly* & *completely*.

Beloved, our Lord knows us & keeps us & He has something to say to us...

The Lord knows we are faithful. That's good!

- 1. **What would Jesus say to** *our* **church...?** When the *Son of Man* spoke to the *saints at Ephesus*, He first offered several words of *encouragement*.
 - a. **Read vv.2&3.** As you read, you probably noticed there was some *repetition*. That emphasizes what's *good* like *perseverance*.
 - b. I'm going to divide Jesus' *commendation* (2,3) into: *hard work*, a *strict guard*, & a *long race*.
- 2. This was a hard working bunch of believers (v.2)!
 - a. Jesus began by simply recognizing their *deeds works*. We've just read in *Ephesians* that God *saved us* for a life of *good works* (2:10): For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for goods works, which God prepared beforehand that we might walk in them.
 - b. And they worked hard. "Toil" (2) is related to a Gr verb (κοπιαζω) which suggested *copious labor*. Maybe we could think of it as *spiritual ditch digging*...
 - c. The Ephesians had *perseverance*.
 - i. They were like the *Olympic Marathon Team* of the *Kingdom of Christ*.
 - ii. They had been faithfully running the race for 40 years!
- 3. And while they *worked hard*, they didn't neglect their *holiness* or their *teaching*. They kept a *strict guard*...
 - a. There was no place in this church for evil men. A generation earlier the apostle Paul had warned (Eph 5): But immorality or any impurity or greed must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints; and there must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, but rather giving of thanks. For this you know w/ certainty, that no immoral or impure person or covetous man, who is an idolater, has an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ & God.

- b. There was no place in their pulpit for false apostles & teachers. Almost 40 years earlier Paul had gathered the Ephesian elders around him w/ this warning (Acts 20): "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. I know that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your own selves men will arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after them. Therefore be on the alert..."
 - i. The church has always been threatened by *false teachers* & *predatory would-be leaders*.
 - ii. **Simon Kistemaker** notes the **NT** evidences of *true apostles* (2 Cor 11& 12): they *preach Jesus' gospel, perform Spirit-powered miracles,* & *perform those signs with perseverance.*
 - iii. The Ephesian elders *tested* the *heretics* & *so-called apostles* against biblical standards and *found* them *false*.
- 4. The *Ephesian church* had been a *good church* for a *long time* (**re-read v. 3**). They had *run* a *long race*.
 - a. This is the **second** time Jesus commended their *perseverance* (also 2). Being *faithful* for the *long haul* can get kind of *wearying* but these believers had a lot of *spiritual stamina!*
 - b. Their "enduring" (another repeated term) was motivated by the honor of Christ's name. This could be a reference to enduring through persecution...
 - i. We've noted several times in the past year that *Ephesus* was home to the *Temple of Artemis*, one *the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World*.
 - ii. By the end of the 1st century, so by the time this letter was dictated, the *Empire* had built *another* temple in Ephesus, one to the worship of the *Roman Emperors*. Roman citizens were expected to confess that "Caesar is lord."

- iii. But the *Ephesian saints* apparently held *fast*, knowing that **only** at the *name of Jesus* should *every knee bow & tongue confess* that *Jesus Christ is Lord* to the glory of God the Father (Phil 2:10,11).
- c. And though I've noted that for many, *persevering faithfulness* can become *wearying*, it seemingly was *not so* for the *Ephesians*. The *Son of Man* noted (3b) that this church *had not grown weary*...
- 5. *Hard work*, a *strict guard*, & a *long race*. These are *qualities* that many of us *prize highly*... What would you *think* of the church at Ephesus if Jesus' letter *simply stopped* **here**...?

The Ephesian church had toiled & tested & endured faithfully for four decades! Isn't being faithful good enough...?

No! Merely *toiling on* in the Kingdom is not *enough*.

1. **Read v.4.** "But" – in contrast to the *list of good* is **one** *indictment*. Just **one**, but it is the *most important point* in Jesus' brief *communique*. **V.4** is the *most important sentence* in the letter: *you have left your first love*

2. What is **first** *love*?

- a. To be fair, it does seem the Ephesians had *some* love. All of the *good fruit* came from some good *soil*. But their love was not *first love*.
- b. Christian love includes *love* for one another, *love* for God's Word, *love* for the lost, *love* for holiness.
 - i. But **most** of all, *first love* starts **w**/whole hearted love for **Jesus**.
 - ii. Do you remember what the Lord asked (**3X**) the *struggling* Simon Peter, after the Resurrection (Jn 21)...? "Simon, son of John, do you **love** Me more than these?
 - iii. Do you recall that just a few weeks ago we examined the closing words of *Ephesians* and read in **6:24** that *saving faith* is practically synonymous w/ *incorruptible love* for our Lord Jesus Christ?
 - iv. Can you *reach* back & *reconstruct* Jesus' *response* to the question of *which* commandment is the *greatest...*?
 - 1. Jesus (Mt 22:37): "YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND.' This is the great and foremost commandment."
 - v. *First* **love** is *everything all* in **love** for our Savior Jesus!

- 3. We need to make **two** soul-penetrating observations from Jesus' words (4):
 - a. Although **not** *all* Christians are *alike* in terms of *experience* or *emotion*, Jesus' assumption is that *every* Christian begins their *new life* w/ some sense of *whole-hearted first love* for our *Savior*.
 - b. Second. This Christian "first love" is huge....
 - i. It's *huge* because it *towers over & against* that impressive list of *works* in the rest of the letter.
 - ii. But mostly it's *huge* because Jesus says: "I have this against you..." Jesus takes it personally when you scoot away from Him.
- 4. Do you *remember* your *first love* for Jesus?
 - a. What did you *feel*, what did you *think*, what did *do*, where did you *go*, what *battles* did you fight, when you first *knew* that you were *His*!?!
 - b. This week my thoughts rewound to 1972; my:
 - i. first *prayer meeting* (H.S.; industrial arts class-room before first period).
 - ii. First *Action Group* (teen Bible study) in Kenny Chapin's basement.
 - iii. The silver cross I bought to wear around my neck.
 - iv. Jesus patch sewn on my denim jacket.
 - v. The *big white cross* I stenciled on the back my **m/c** helmet.
 - vi. Friends, do you remember you first love...?

The Ephesians maintained their building & manned their programs & guarded their pulpit ... but neglected their hearts.

There is a fix for "first love lost" (read v.5).

- 1. Now let's make a **3rd** *crucial* observation from Jesus' words: every Christian can *recapture* his *first love*...! That's what that "*therefore*" is *there for*! ☺
- 2. Jesus gives 3 instructions for recovering lost love: remember, repent, repeat. You need to follow each step.
 - a. **Remember**. Remember from **where** you have fallen. This is in the present tense you should always have your first love on the front burner of your heart. ?What was your Christian life like when you knew that you loved Him w/ every fiber of your existence?
 - i. Your relationships? Your patience? Your humility? Your distaste for sinful habits? Your spiritual hunger? Your eagerness to be a part of Jesus' church? Your concern for lost friends? Your fascination w/ Scripture? Your priority for your prayer closet?
 - ii. Jesus isn't so much asking you if you do remember, He is commanding you to bring it all back to your heart & mind.
 - b. Repent. One you've pictured the target, turn towards it. Want it!
 - i. Don't *excuse* yourself. → "Hey! I come to *church*. I'm on a few *committees*. I've *cleaned-up* my life...!"
 - ii. Beloved, don't minimize this & settle for a tepid faith ("I'm just not a "love" & "excitement" kind of guy...!" Well, how loud are you gonna scream for that football team tonight?).
 - c. **Repeat**. V.5 Do the deeds you did at **first**...**f**ueled by **first** love.
 - i. Real *repenting* means *pursuing* & *repeating* the *first love lifestyle*.

- 3. This is a *completely optimistic* word from Jesus!
 - a. You *can* recapture in your *first love* for Him!
 - b. You don't start by *mustering up* an *emotion*. You start by *repenting* of your *cold* ways & then, in faith, begin to *do* those *first love things*.
- 4. **Or** *else*... Jesus says if a *church* will not *repent* of its cold *formalism* & of its *deeds* **not** fueled by *first love*...
 - a. ...He comes & He removes.
 - b. Every church is a *golden lampstand* a *precious* source of *gospel light* in a *dark world*.
 - c. But no matter how big or busy we are, if we won't *love* Him, He'll *snuff out* our *ministry*...
 - d. I'm not convinced He'll *close* our doors, but I think He'll remove our *bright gospel witness*.
 - i. Like the **OT** *Temple* after the *Shekinah glory of God* withdrew.
 - ii. The beautiful building was still there but God was gone!
 - iii. The Hebrew word is "ichabod" "the glory has departed." We don't want **that** inscribed over our door...
 - e. But if we don't love Him, maybe we won't even notice.

That is a *chilling* threat but Jesus ends His letter w/ a word of *hope* (read v.7).

- 1. "He who has an ear, let him hear..." The Lord used to use that expression to call attention to His teaching while walking among us in Galilee &Judea.
 - a. The point is, pay attention. Please don't write off this complaint!
 - b. Jesus speaks by His *Holy Spirit*. He *speaks* to the churches while our *lampstand* is still *lit* while there is still *time* to do something!
 - i. *Heed* the *warning*: search your soul; have you moved away from your *whole hearted, first love* for *Jesus*?
 - ii. Pursue the **remedy**: remember, repent & repeat the things you did at **first**. ... When your love was fresh.
- 2. Because if you do, you will overcome!
 - a. To "overcome" is going to appear in the closing of each of the **seven** Revelation letters.
 - i. It comes from the Greek word for "victory" from which we get "Nike."
 - ii. Jesus' word, of course, is filled w/ hope: we **can** overcome the failure of which we've been indicted: ...leaving our first.
 - b. So the first characteristic of an *overcomer* is here (7): he/she *recaptures* his *first love*...her *initial devotion* to Christ.

- c. And... *you can*!
 - i. The **NT** promises that *overcoming* is a part of your *new nature*. We aren't *perfect* but we keep *overcoming*. It's what Christians *do*:
 - ii. **1 John 5** (there the Apostle John wrote): For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith. Who is the one who overcomes the world, but he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?
 - iii. If it wasn't possible Jesus wouldn't say so!
- 3. And He wouldn't hold out the *promise* of an *overcomer's reward*: *to eat of the tree of life which is in the Paradise of God*.
 - a. The *imagery* here (and *Rev* is colored w/ vivid *biblical imagery*) is straight out of *Genesis*. The same *tree of life* which held eternal life; And "paradise" a rare word which suggests an *incredible*, beautiful garden.
 - b. Which simply promises us (7) that the *overcomer's reward* is *eternal life* in a *glorious Heaven*.

Life forever with "the One" – the Son of Man – our Savior Jesus – our <u>first love</u>.

What kills *love...*? I'm sure there are lot's *threats*, but here are **three**: *distance*, *diet & time*!

- 1. *Distance*. You put too much *distance* between yourself & *Jesus' Bride*, the *church*.
 - a. Last year in Eph.4 we learned that the local church is God's *training* center for equipping the saints. The church is where we grow.
 - b. In this morning's letter, Jesus is *all about* the church! He *walks* in the midst of the churches. He holds them in His *strong right hand*. His Spirit *speaks* to the churches.
 - c. You can't have a first love for Jesus w/o loving His Bride.

2. **Diet**.

- a. If you work like a dog all day long in the hot sun and you never stop to rest & drink & eat...
- b. ...by the end of the *afternoon* maybe today's chores are *all done*, but you are *burned-out & dehydrated*.
- c. Jesus calls you to *come aside* & *drink the Living Water*.

3. **Time**.

- a. If you've been a Christian a *long time*, serving can become another *routine*. You focus on the *ministry*, the *tradition*, the *habits*, but **not** your *love*.
- b. And there is another aspect of time that is particularly interesting in this letter to the Ephesians. By 90 AD the church at Ephesus had been around almost 40 years. Many members in Ephesus were the children/grandchildren of the original members. Bible teacher Simon Kistemaker makes this observation about 2nd generation saints:

 This church Jesus addressed [in Ephesus] no long consisted of first-generation believers but of second & third generation Christians.

 These people lacked the enthusiasm their parents & grandparents had demonstrated. They functioned not as (champions) of the faith but as caretakers & custodians. ... They loved the Lord but no longer w/heart, soul, & mind.

To young & old I repeat Jesus' remedy for love lost: **remember** – the warmth of your first love; **repent** – of anything that quenches your passion for Christ; **repeat** – the things you did when your love was **new**. \odot ...**pray**...
