22 And at the land they will look And Behold: distress and darkness! Gloom of adversity! The Part that Doesn't Fit...

- ... is the part that Matthew quotes!
 - Major supporting evidence for unity of Isaiah
 - Breaks the poetic structure in order to stand-out.
 - Was literally fulfilled in the First Advent of Messiah.
- Matt 4:14-16:
 - 14 This was to fulfill what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet:
 - 15 "The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali,

By the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—

16 "The people who were sitting in darkness saw a great Light, And those who were sitting in the land and shadow of death, Upon them a Light dawned."

Geography Matters

- The LAND includes much more than Judea.
- In Jesus' day, the Judeans were prejudiced against the people in Samaria and Galilee because they were racially mixed.
- Yet God's covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob includes all 12 Tribes.
- The Land is His gift to Jacob, including Zebulun and Naphtali.
- This prophecy from Isaiah is used in Matthew to remind the world of God's plan for Israel, based on His Grace.
- He has not finished with them, whether in Judea or anywhere on earth. Proof passage for a future glory in Israel: Is 4:2-6, Rom 11:26.

Back to the Prophecy in its Context: 9:2-7

Is 9:2-7

- The people who walked in darkness Have seen a great light; Those who dwelt in the land of the shadow of death, Upon them a light has shined. You have multiplied the nation And increased its joy; They rejoice before You According to the joy of harvest, As men rejoice when they divide the burden
 - And the staff of his shoulder. The rod of his oppressor,
 - As in the day of Midian.

5 For every warrior's sandal from the noisy battle, And garments rolled in blood, Will be used for burning and fuel of fire. For unto us a Child is born, Unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Major Themes

- 1. God does the shining of light.
- 2. Man is in darkness because of his own rebellion.
- 3. God brought the darkness.
- 4. Therefore it is His to remove in grace.
- 5. Man has free will to make decisions, but he has no choice whatsoever about the consequences of those decisions.

An Expectation of Literal Fulfillment

- 1. God's focus remains on the Land and the People to whom He gave it.
- 2. Joy is God's eternal experience.
- 3. Therefore it is His to dispense.
- 4. He will cause light and joy for Israel, and they will rejoice in His presence.
- 5. No happiness or enjoyment in life can compare to fellowship with God on His terms.
 - Health & Wealth vs. Doom & Gloom

Jesus Came, but...

- 1. Part of this prophecy was fulfilled in the First Advent and part was not.
- Which parts? The Light shined in the dark place, Matt 4:14-16 and 17.\
- 3. The Israel did not rejoice in the presence of the LORD.
- 4. The disconnect with what happened and what Isaiah prophesied tells us either that God failed to fulfill what He said or that Isaiah 9 is not done yet!
- 5. Your categorical eschatology comes from a verse-byverse exegetical, historical observation of the Text.



Jesus in Contrast to Gentile Oppression of Israel

- 28 "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavyladen, and I will give you rest.
- 29 **"Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for** I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.
- **30 "For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."**
- 1. There *is* a yoke of authority!!
- 2. It is a burden of righteousness.
- 3. The King's subjects may bear it only by God's grace.
- 4. The answer is a *different* authority, not *no* authority.
