Sermon: We Must Know Our High Priest! "The Faithful Outcasts" Pt.7

I Text:

Old Covenant: Exodus 29 New Covenant: *Hebrews 3:1-6*

II Doctrine:

Jesus Christ both very God and very man is the true High Priest who was being alluded to in the scriptures. The literal thousands of years of sacrifices and rituals conducted by the earthly High Priest, all pointed to Messiah Jesus. We must understand the subject of the Old Testament High Priest to appreciate this teaching.

The living God himself declares how faithful Moses was during his life. Although Moses had a special relationship with God he is still a servant of God, and his son Jesus Christ. Moses is a servant in the house of Jesus the Messiah.

The same point had to be made in the New Testament concerning John the Baptist and our Lord Jesus Christ! God has appointed many spokesman through the ages, but he has only one son.

III Comparing Scripture With Scripture:
