







- Faith (Heb. 11:4)"




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"The False Religion of Cain"

Additional: Cain's impact (4:16-24)

"Cain is the father of the evil world system.

This is the wicked civilization that is God's enemy and that God tells His people not to love (Jas. 4:4; I John 2:15-17).

It is a world:

- That tries to live without God (Gen. 4:16)
- Of the glorification of man (Gen. 4:17)
- Of immorality and corruption of marriage (Gen. 4:19)
- Of music and art (Gen. 4:21) music can be used for good and evil
- Of technology and inventiveness (Gen. 4:20-24)
- Of violence (Gen. 4:23)
- Of pride (Gen. 4:24)
- Of vengeance (Gen. 4:24)"

"...it is through Seth that the line of Christ descends (Gen. 4:25-26)."



Additional: Genealogy (Gen.5)

"The genealogies of the Bible are very important, because they trace the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah. It is one of the ways the Old testament points to Christ (Luke 24:44)."

"This chapter reminds us that God has given revelation to men throughout the centuries. Luke 1:70 and Acts 3:21 say that God has spoken by his holy prophets 'since the world began'.

Additional: "Christ's Genealogy" (Gen.5)

"It has been observed that the names of the men in Christ's genealogy in Genesis 5 preach the gospel."

- Adam "man"
- Seth "appointed"
- Enoch "mortal"
- Kenan "sorrow"
- Mahalael "the blessed God

- Jared "shall come down"
- Enoch "teaching"
- Methuselah "his death shall bring"
- Lamech "despairing"
- Noah "comfort, rest"

"Man is appointed to mortality and sorrow, but the blessed God shall come down teaching and his death shall bring the despairing comfort."

Additional: Genealogy (Gen.5)

Notice with Cain's genealogy there is no references to length of years.

Pr 10:7 ¶ The memory of the just is blessed: but the name of the wicked shall rot.

Pr 10:25 As the whirlwind passeth, so is the wicked no more: but the righteous is an everlasting foundation.

Ec 8:13 But it shall not be well with the wicked, neither shall he prolong his days, which are as a shadow; because he feareth not before God.

CONCLUSION


