

## Generosity is about the:

I. People –"Every creditor that lends" (vs. 1-3)

Different terms for:

- A. Family "he shall not exact it... of his brother"
- **B.** Friends "he shall not exact it of his neighbor"
- C. Foreigners "of a foreigner thou may exact it again"

**II. Principles** – "carefully hearken to the voice of the Lord" (vs. 4-6) *Guarding our:* 

A. Inheritance - "the Lord thy God gives thee for an inheritance"

- **B.** Investment "thou shall lend unto many nations"
- C. Independence "they shall not reign over thee"

**III. P**oor – "a poor man of one of thy brethren" (vs.7-11) *Giving that engages our:* 

- A. Heart-"thou shall not harden thine heart"
- **B.** Hand "Thou shall open thine hand wide unto thy brother"
- C. Happiness "thine heart shall not be grieved when thou giveth"
