What Will We Teach Our Children?

Deuteronomy 6: 1 - 25 January 29, 2012

"Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come." (1 Corinthians 10:11 ESV)

God's Call For Relational Obedience Must Be Written On Our Hearts, (vs. 1 - 25)

- Our Relationship With God Must Be Our Testimony & Not Just A Method Of Evangelism, (vs. 20 25)
 We Must Be Obedient And Share Our Legacy Of Following The Commands Of God, (vs. 24)
 - A. True obedience is not forced or coerced, it is the natural expression of our love for God, (vs. 24a); "Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." (Matthew 6:31-33, ESV)

B. The natural expression of our love for God places us in the center of His care, (vs. 24b); "But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."" (Romans 10:8–13, ESV)

5.	We Must Be Specific And Share Our Legacy Of Imputed Righteousness Before God, (vs. 25)
