- A. Responsibility "The Lord your God has given you this land"

- II. Enjoin "And I commanded Joshua at that time" (vs. 21-22)

 Prescribing that we:
 - A. Remember "eyes have seen all the Lord your God has done"
 - **B.** Revere "Ye shall not fear them"
 - C. Rely "the Lord your God He shall fight for you"
- III. Encourage "But charge Joshua...encourage him" (vs. 23-29)

 Strengthening the:
- A. Excluded "thou shalt not go over this Jordan"
- B. Entrusted "charge Joshua, and ... strengthen him"
- C. Excited "he shall cause them to inherit the land"
