

## B. Solomon's PROOFS that 'ALL is VANITY'. (2:1ff)

- 1. Experiment #1: \_\_\_\_\_. (2:1-11)
  - a. His first test / experiment regarded "mirth" or to "\_\_\_\_\_". (2:1a) The Hebrew word refers to the enjoyment that comes from the physical senses. These pleasures may be positive /righteous (Prov. 10:28), negative / sinful (Prov. 21:17), or merely involving neutral activities which are done with unrealistic expectations of finding lasting meaning and purpose in life apart from God. This Solomon pursued with reckless abandonment (2:1b)
  - b. His *first conclusion* was "surely, this also is \_\_\_\_\_" (2:1c), which means that which is transitory, and therefore lacking in lasting purpose, meaning, or fulfillment. Keep in mind that this is "pleasure", "joy" or "happiness" strictly from a human perspective apart from the Lord which involves ONLY things "under heaven." Thus, it acts as a goad to destroy our false beliefs and worldly hopes to point us to the true source and means of lasting happiness and meaning in life.
    - Principle to remember: The chief end of man is to \_\_\_\_\_\_ God by His amazing grace. True \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ in life is the by-product of knowing Jesus Christ as Savior and walking by faith in fellowship with Him and His Word resulting in doing His will as a steward of what He gives you. (Psalm 1:1-3; 16:11; 36:7-9; 1 Timothy 6:17-19)



- c. His lanes on the dead-end street of pleasure involve ...
  - 1) \_\_\_\_\_\_. (2:2) The NET Bible states that this word "laughter" is "always used in contexts of self-indulgent banqueting, drinking, frivolous partying and merrymaking (Eccl 2:2; 7:3, 6; 10:19). It is distinct from "healthy" joy and laughter (Ps 126:2; Job 8:21). The connotation of "frivolous merrymaking" fits this context best."
    - What does Solomon conclude about this? "I said of laughter "\_\_\_\_\_!" {utter foolishness}; and of mirth, "What does it accomplish?" (2:2). Anticipated answer: !

2)

. (2:3) "I searched in my heart how to \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ {to enjoy, cheer, indulge, gratify} my flesh with \_\_\_\_\_, while guiding my heart with \_\_\_\_\_, and how to lay hold on folly {which stems from self-indulgence of wine / drugs etc. – behaving foolishly}, till I might see {discover} what was good {profitable, good; an interrogative particle – 'what or where is the good' for the sons of men {Adam / man} to do under heaven {apart from the Lord } all the days { the few days } of their lives. What does this remind us of again? What is the biblical balance regarding drinking alcohol?

- 3) \_\_\_\_\_\_. (2:4-6) "I made {made; undertook} my works {projects, achievements} great, I built {for} myself houses, and planted {for} myself vineyards {SOS 8:11-12}. 5 I made {for} myself gardens and orchards {orchards & parks}, and I planted all kinds of fruit trees in them. 6 I made {constructed – for} myself water pools {for irrigation} from which to water the growing trees of the grove. Why does mankind like to create and make things? Can there be a sense of accomplishment in doing so? Is this wrong? What is a biblical view of "work"?
- 4) \_\_\_\_\_\_. (2:7a) "I acquired male and female servants, and had servants born in my house." Who were these 'servants' and what was their function? Did this result in lasting satisfaction?
- 5) \_\_\_\_\_\_. (2:7b) "Yes, I had greater possessions of herds and flocks than all who were in Jerusalem before me." Why would this be needed and what did it prove? What must you remember as a believer in Christ? (1 Tim. 6:17-19)
- 6) \_\_\_\_\_\_. (2:8a) "I also gathered {amassed; collected} for myself silver and gold and the special treasures of kings and of the provinces." 1 Kings 10:14-29 says 666 talents of gold poured in yearly to Solomon along with special treasures. This is 25 tons of gold, the equivalent of \$1.3BB annually in today's dollar. What did our Lord remind us of about this? (Matthew 6:19-21)
- 7) \_\_\_\_\_\_. (2:8b) "I acquired male and female singers, the delights of the sons of men, and musical instruments of all kinds." What would a party or entertainment be without music which requires singers, instruments, etc.? What is a biblical view of music?
- d. His self-evaluation of his pursuit of self-indulgent pleasure was, "So I became great {by way of honor & glory and excelled {surpassed in wealth} more than all who were before me in Jerusalem. Also my wisdom {reasoning, objectivity} remained with me. 10 Whatever my eyes desired I did not keep {restrain; deny} from them. I did not withhold {refuse; hold back} my heart from any pleasure, For my heart rejoiced {found pleasure and some temporary enjoyment & happiness} in all my labor {tremendous amount of exertion, efforts, & burden}; And this was my reward from all my labor. (2:9-10)
- e. His final conclusion was, "Then I looked {considered, reflected, evaluated} on all the works that my hands had done And {I reflected} on the labor in which I had toiled; {Was it worth it with lasting value?}And indeed all was vanity { transitory, and therefore lacking in lasting purpose, meaning, or fulfillment and grasping for the wind {elusive}. There was no profit {net gain} under the sun." (2:11) Did his experiments regarding pleasure fail? What word kept popping up throughout this passage and what can you learn from this?
