1. <u>2C5:21</u> - crucially important verse - today: *the righteousness of God.* 

## 1st: Martin Luther's Discovery

- **1.** R1:16-17 was interpreted as God's judgment on sinners. Vulgate justificare: "justus' = justice + "ficare" = to make. RCC makes men righteous, justified
- 2. Luther studied Greek term: not making, but a declaration by a court
- **3.** *revealed to faith* passively trusting God to give "alien" righteousness.
- **4.** "When I discovered that, I felt that I was born again of the Holy Ghost & the doors of paradise swung open & I walked thru."
- 5. How does this righteousness relate to faith from faith to faith. Hab 2:4

## 2nd: The Bible's References to The Righteousness of God

- **1.** Rm 3:21-22 *manifested* [historical event] to wh/ OT *testified* & is now revealed in gospel. *Righteousness of God* defines believers in Christ
- 2. Rm 10:1-4 rejection due to misdirected zeal, faith in *their own righteousness*, culpable ignorance & rebellion. Jesus is the living embodiment of the righteousness of God.
- **3.** <u>Jms 1:19-20</u> the Christian is to be a display of *the righteousness of God:* sanctification a life of faith. <u>Hb 10:37-38</u> [Hab 2:4]. Paul: The righteous by faith will live. Heb: The righteous will live by faith.
- **4.** It is said that Luther turned RCC on it's head: RCC believe in order to work in order to become justified. Luther: believe in order to be justified & then work in order to demonstrate life, faith, love.
- **5.** Appreciate something of the spectrum of meaning in the phrase *the right-eousness of God*.
- **6.** Let us minister this message & deed & word. Our sufficiency is not in ourselves but in the Spirit who empowers God's word[s]. <u>2C 5:21</u>
