A Fight to the Death

Colossians 3:5-11

- 5. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry.
- 6. On account of these the wrath of God is coming.
- 7. In these you too once walked, when you were living in them.
- 8. But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth.
- 9. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices
- 10. and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator.
- 11. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

Two areas in which you must kill sin because of your union with Christ

1. Sins in your body

verses 5-7

2. Sins in Christ's body

verses 8-11

Four "R"s on how to kill sin

- 1. Remember your union with Christ
- 2. Recognize your sin
- 3. Repent
- 4. Replace it with the right response

Questions for Personal Reflection

- 5. Is my motivation for killing sin driven by my identity in Christ or my own efforts? In other words, am I setting my mind on the things that are above as the starting point for killing my sin?
- 6. Do I know what sins to which I am most prone? If so, what is my plan for killing it? If not, take time to figure it out and as those who know me best for help.
- 7. Do I see my sin the way God sees it, as deserving of His wrath? Or do I downplay my sin in any way?
- 8. How does my new identity in Christs and God's work of renewal (v 10) give me hope in the battle against my sin?
- 9. Will I be a unity builder? Or a unity breaker?
