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**WCF Ch. 5. Of Providence. 2.** Although, in relation to the foreknowledge and decree of God, the first Cause, all things come to pass immutably, and infallibly; yet, by the same providence, He ordereth them to fall out, according to the nature of second causes, either necessarily, freely, or contingently. **WLC Q. 61.** Are all they saved who hear the gospel, and live in the Church? A. All that hear the gospel, and live in the visible Church, are not saved; but only they who are true members of the Church invisible. **WLC Q. 62.** What is the visible Church? A. The visible Church is a society made up of all such as in all ages and places of the world do profess the true religion, and of their children. **WLC Q. 63.** What are the special privileges of the visible Church? A. The visible Church hath the privilege of being under God's special care and government; of being protected and preserved in all ages, notwithstanding the opposition of all enemies; and of enjoying the communion of saints, the ordinary means of salvation, and offers of grace by Christ to all the members of it in the ministry of the gospel, testifying, that whosoever believes in him shall be saved, and excluding none that will come unto him.

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**WLC Q. 91.** What is the duty which God requireth of man? A. The duty which God requireth of man is obedience to his revealed will. **WCF Ch. 27. Of the Sacraments. 5.** The sacraments of the old testament in regard of the spiritual things thereby signified and exhibited, were, for substance, the same with those of the new. (1 Cor. 10:1-4) **WLC Q. 147.** What are the duties required in the tenth commandment? A. The duties required in the tenth commandment are, such a full contentment with our own condition, and such a charitable frame of the whole soul toward our neighbor, as that all our inward motions and affections touching him, tend unto, and further all that good which is his. **WLC Q. 148.** What are the sins forbidden in the tenth commandment? A. The sins forbidden in the tenth commandment are, discontentment with our own estate; envying, and grieving at the good of our neighbor, together with all inordinate motions and affections to anything that is his.
