## Watch and Pray! Matthew 26:31-46 March 8, 2015

## **Main Point:**

When it comes to trials and temptation, your spirit may be willing, but your flesh is weak; therefore, just as Jesus did on your behalf, watch and pray.

1. Like the disciples, when it comes to trials and temptation, it's easy to think you won't succumb.

2. But what you can't forget is that, while your spirit may be willing, your flesh is weak.

3. In order to avoid succumbing to trials and temptation, you must watch and pray.

4. You will be strengthened as you do so because Jesus perfectly watched and prayed on your behalf.

**Galatians 5:17** <sup>17</sup> For the flesh lusts against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; and these are contrary to one another, so that you do not do the things that you wish. (NKJV)
