Loving one another requires forgiving those who sin against us
Matthew 18:21-35

I. Introduction: Steve Saint: How the son of a martyr came to forgive his father's killer

The broader context of this text in Matthew 18:
the seriousness with which sin is to be dealt with
the final word in this sermon is not *excommunication*, but *forgiveness*

Amazing grace! God forgives our insurmountable sin debt

Our hopeless debt, our only plea, and God's infinite mercy

C. The unmerciful servant does not forgive a smaller debt owed him (28-31)

We need to understand the magnitude of our sin debt

Does forgiveness require repentance?

1. immediate forgiveness from the heart

Luke 11:4, Mark 11:25, Col 3:12, Eph 4:24

2. restorative forgiveness requires repentance

Luke 17:3-5

D. The king's reaction to the unmerciful servant (32-34)

True Gospel forgiveness, while having no required conditions, is not without expected consequences.

E. The Christian's response to judgment (35)

Does this teach salvation by works?

What about "eternal security?"
