Wisdom for Life in a Fallen World Ecclesiastes 1:1-2

Main Point:

Ecclesiastes will guide you and help you make sense of your life in a fallen world; therefore, study it to obtain this wisdom from Jesus.

1. Ecclesiastes is a difficult, but helpful, book of the Bible.

- 2. It's a book that, through personal experience, warns you to reject the secular mindset.
- 3. It's a book that is honest about the frustrations of life and that answers the big questions of life.
- 4. It's a book that shows you how meaning and joy are found only in a relationship with God.
- 5. It's a book where Jesus Christ imparts His wisdom to you for living in this fallen world.
