WE APPROACH THE LORD

Prelude

Call toWorship

Our call to magnify the Lord is set today in the midst of a celebration of the salvation that God provides for all who look to Him, consisting of refuge, righteousness, and redemption.

Psalm 34 ESV

- I will bless the LORD at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth.
- ² My soul makes its boast in the LORD; let the humble hear and be glad.
- ³ Oh, magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together!
- ⁴ I sought the LORD, and he answered me and delivered me from all my fears.
- ⁵Those who look to him are radiant, and their faces shall never be ashamed.
- ⁶This poor man cried, and the LORD heard him and saved him out of all his troubles.
- ⁷The angel of the LORD encamps around those who fear him, and delivers them.

* Reading from the Law

We read in these two key passages of the responsibility those who claim remission of their sins through Christ have to mortify those sins and turn from them in repentance, a message that should convict all true believers of any complacency into which we might fall from time to time, necessitating our confession and repentance now.

I Corinthians 5:6-8 ESV

⁶ Your boasting is not good. Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump? ⁷ Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be a new lump, as you really are unleavened. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. ⁸ Let us therefore celebrate the festival, not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Romans 8:12-14 ESV

¹² So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. ¹³ For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴ For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.

Silent Confession of Sin

Corporate Confession of Sin

The spirit of true repentance is expressed in this classic prayer of confession

Corporate Confession: Almighty and most merciful Father; We have erred and strayed from Your ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against Your holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; And we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us. O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare those, O God, who confess their faults. Restore those who are penitent; According to Your promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord. And grant, O merciful Father, for His sake; That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life; To the glory of Your holy name. Amen. Almighty and most merciful Father; We have erred and strayed from Your ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against Your holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; And we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us. Assurance of Pardoning Grace

A comprehensive understanding of salvation is expressed in this well-known passage from Romans, which assures true believers of their freedom from condemnation while asserting that the purpose of such freedom is that they might keep the Law's commandments, which they are enabled increasingly to do through the Holy Spirit.

Romans 8:1-4 ESV

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ² For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³ For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Leader: This is the gospel. Congregation: Hallelujah!

* Hymn of Assurance

We rejoice in the certainty of pardon through the work of Christ in this great hymn, in which by faith we assert our confidence in the sufficiency of His work on our behalf.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.

Offering Meditation

Our "spiritual worship" or "reasonable service," however one chooses to translate it, consists in offering our whole selves to God (the meaning of the burnt offering, and, in part, of the Passover Lamb, which was to be completely eaten and/or burnt), an act of which our tithes and offerings today are a token.

Romans 12:1 ESV

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.
