Generosity for the Glory of God Philippians 4:10-20 March 3, 2013

Main Point:

Because God promises to provide for you, glorify Him by generously meeting the needs of your brethren.

1. Generosity is well-pleasing to God.

2. In order to generously meet the needs of your brethren, you need to enter into their lives.

3. Generously meet the needs of your brethren as you have opportunity.

4. Generously meet the needs of your brethren repeatedly.

5. Generously meeting the needs of your brethren requires sacrifice on your part.

6. Generously meet the needs of your brethren because God generously provides for you in Christ Jesus.
