Two men with great need encounter a Savior with great power.

1. Two Men with Great Need

vv. 30-31

(1) Their Plight

(2) Their Petition

"And behold, two blind men sitting by the road, when they heard that Jesus was passing by, cried out, saying, 'Have mercy on us, O Lord, Son of David!'"

- Blind

- Entirely destitute - reduced to begging

- Their understanding - their faith

"Lord, Son of David!"

- Their proper plea

"Have mercy on us"

- Their earnestness

(3) Their Persistence

"Then the multitude warned them that they should be quiet; but they cried out all the more, saying, 'Have mercy on us, O Lord, Son of David!'"

- obstacles! opposition!

- they cried out all the more!

2. A Savior with Great Power

vv. 32-34

(1) He takes notice!

"So Jesus stood still and called them"

(2) He calls them

(3) He invites their petition

"What do you want Me to do for you?"

(4) He has compassion on them and heals them

"So Jesus had compassion and touched their eyes. And immediately their eyes received sight, and they followed Him."

- The healing is immediate!
- They follow Jesus!

A Vivid Picture of Christ's Saving Work -

1. The Lost Sinner

- Blindness a biblical picture of man's lost condition
- The consequences of sin: moral poverty

2. The Awakened Sinner

- Knows his true need
- Will not be put off
- Keeps crying out for mercy
- Knows exactly what to ask for!

3. The Saved Sinner

- A dramatic change! He sees a whole world to which he was previously blind!
- The change is evident to all!
- He is wholly devoted to that One who delivered him.
