#### Background to Psalm 61

- This psalm is about one who has a sense of "far-awayness from God" (v.2)
- Psalms 61-63 comprise a cluster of 3 songs of a man who HUNGERS FOR GOD.
- David wrote this for the Choir Director according to Jeduthun. Jeduthun was a "choir-master" appointed by David (together with Heman & Asaph). See 1 Chron 16.41-42 & 1 Chron 25:1-6.

THESIS — when you feel THE FAR-AWAYNESS from God — what do you do? Some devotional & pastoral applications from the divine song.

From When I Don't Desire God, by John Piper:

- → "Most of your unhappiness in life comes from the fact that you are listening to yourself instead of talking to yourself."
- →"Well, God does not mean for us to be passive. He means for us to fight the fight of faith—the fight for joy. And the central strategy is to preach the gospel to yourself.
- → "God and God alone is the final, ultimate goal of our quest. All that God is for us in Jesus is the Object of our quest for joy. When I speak of fighting for joy, I mean joy in God, not joy without reference to God. When I speak of longing for happiness, I mean happiness in all that God is for us in Jesus."

# **Extolling God's Grace in the Gospel Together:**
