"The Christ Who Seeks Out the Lost" Luke 19:1-10

Our Lord Jesus Christ delights to seek out and to save the 'outcasts'!

1. The Man Who Needed Grace

vv. 1-2

"Zacchaeus who was a chief tax collector,

- A chief tax collector; a well-known 'sinner!' (cf. v. 7)

and he was rich"

2. The Divine Appointment of Grace

vv. 3-5

- (1) **Zacchaeus seeking Jesus** "he ran ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see Him, for He was going to pass that way."
 - Very eager to see Jesus!
 - Willing to make a spectacle of himself to humble himself in order to do so!
- (2) Jesus seeking Zacchaeus
 - For this He had come to Jericho
 - He already knew Zacchaeus
- He knew precisely where Zacchaeus would be
- He already knew He would dine at his house

"And when Jesus came to the place, He looked up and said to him, 'Zacchaeus, make haste and come down, for today I must stay at your house."

3. The Work of Grace in the Heart

vv. 6-10

(1) Rejoicing at 'Welcoming' Grace (6)

"So he made haste and came down, and received Him joyfully."

- (2) Complaining at 'Welcoming' Grace (7) "But when they saw it, they all complained, saying, 'He has gone to be a guest
 - It is those who have never tasted of saving grace who complain against it!

with a man who is a sinner."

(3) The Evidences of Saving Grace (8-9)

-1- Gratitude to God

"Look, Lord, I give half of my goods to the poor"

-2- A remarkable Detachment from the things of this world

-3- Repentance and Restitution

"if I have taken anything from anyone by false accusation, I restore fourfold."

- (4) Our Lord's Declaration of His Mission of Grace (10)
 - -1- Realized in Zacchaeus and his house

"Today salvation has come to this house, because he also is a son of Abraham."

- He was a chosen of God!
- A happy beneficiary of God's promise to redeem a people for Himself!

-2- Ever Carried Forward by Christ alone

"for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."

- Christ Himself seeks the lost
- Christ Himself secures their salvation
