## The Perils of False Teaching (2 Timothy 2:14-19) Part I

- Paul concludes first part: why we must not be ashamed of the Gospel
- Paul exhorts Timothy with one of his faithful sayings (vvs11-13)
  The faithful
  - a) For if we died with *Him*, we shall also live with *Him*
  - b) If we endure, we shall also reign with *Him*
  - The faithless
  - a) If we deny Him, He also will deny us
  - b) If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself
- What Paul old Timothy: not just given to him for personal edification
  - I. Warn Them about the Perils of False Teaching (2:14-19)
- Only in a thorough knowledge of God's truth can error truly be discerned
- For this reason, Paul says to Timothy "remind them of these things" 14b
- Remind "them" refers to the whole congregation in Ephesus (2:2)
- "things" refers to what Paul had been saying to Timothy in 2:1-2
- Timothy was to: 14b charge them before Lord not to strive about words to no profit, to the ruin of the hearers
  - a) False Teaching Ruins its hearers (2:14b)

"to the ruin of the hearers"

- b) False Teaching Brings Shame on the Teachers (2:15)
- Paul's 2<sup>nd</sup> warning about false teaching is by means of contrast
  - v15 Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth
- Gal 1:10; 1 Thess 2:4; Matt 25:21- contrast with Phil 3:18; Jude 12,13
