- -Author: Daniel (6:28-7:2, 6f.; 8:1f.; 9:2f.; 10:2f.; 11:1; 12:5f.; Matt. 24:15)
- -Date: 6th Century BC (not 2nd Century)
- -Purpose: to comfort and encourage the Jewish exiles by revealing God's program for them, both during and after the time of Gentile supremacy in the world
