Intro: The Mirror of Heaven

A. Phil. 2:5-8 is an intimate revelations of Jesus Christ's heart

- 1. The Gospels reveals His history
- 2. This passage reveals a glimpse of His mind
- B. Purpose of this glimpse: change reformation
 - 1. Scripture often presents Jesus as the saints' example
 - a. Matt. 11:29: Take my yoke upon you, and learn of Men
 - b John 13:12-17, 34: I have given you an example that ye should do as I
 - c. 1 Peter 2:21: ... leaving us an example that ye should follow His steps

THE GLORY OF THE MIND OF JESUS CHRIST (1)

- I. Ready to forgo His own glory II. Ready to humble Himself III. Ready to fulfill the servant's task
- I. The Glory of the Mind of Jesus in His readiness to forgo His own glory
- A. What was in the 'mind of Jesus?'
 - 1. A readiness to put Himself aside entirely (vs. 5-7)
 - 2. This glorious mind of Jesus is framed more sharply in vs. 6-7
 - a. 6a: He was in the form of God: Col. 1:15; Heb. 1:3; 1 John 1:5
 - b. 6b: He thought it not robbery to be equal with God
 - c. 7a: But made himself of no reputation

B. To appreciate depth of His mind, contrast Him to us as man/woman 1. We were made in image – likeness of God: What did we do? (Genesis 3)
2. He was the express image of God: What did He do?
Living this truth A. What does God call His servants to be: Let Jesus Christ's mind be in you!
B. How are we doing in the life that is 'becoming of the Gospel of Christ?' (1:27) 1. God's purpose is revealing this is change a. His salvation work is all about changing sinners
b. Since we find change difficult, we often resist it
c. Consider this change a may rather than a must
2. What is a changed and worthy of Christ life look like? a. It begins with thinking differently – thinking through Christ's mind
b. It includes <i>leaving our comfort zones</i> (vs. 6-7)
c. It is always asking "What would Jesus do?"
