- 2. Imagine you're Philemon. What are some reasons you might imagine yourself giving Paul to argue against his request to forgive Onesimus? Why do none of these arguments hold water?
- 3. In what areas of your life do you often fail to be gracious in your speech? (Maybe pray for each other, if there's time).
- 4. Can you think of an Onesimus story in your life, where an unlikely person you knew was totally transformed by God's grace?
